

Human Services Degree/AS Degree Program

This program is for those wishing to build a rewarding career helping others who are experiencing personal and socialization problems. This field is on the Workforce Development Boards list of high need and high pay as a growing field. The Associate Degree in human services will prepare you for entry-level positions in social services or for transfer to four-year colleges or universities to pursue human services, psychology, social work, sociology and other related social science majors.

Earning potential: \$19,000-\$32,000 per year

The college would earn the approved status for Certified Addiction Professional, Certified Addiction counselor and Certified Addiction
This degree may be offered online or in a face to face setting.

Program Outcomes:

Upon graduation, the student will:

1. Advocate for people in the community with knowledge about resources in the human services network.
2. Demonstrate an understanding of the needs of a variety of populations including individuals who are chemically dependent, mentally disabled, developmentally disabled or abused.
3. Communicate effectively in interviewing and counseling situations
4. Explain and evaluate the functions of the various levels of professions in human services.
5. analyze various major social issues, social problems
6. Demonstrate knowledge of the basic methods used to evaluate people with mental health and developmental disabilities
7. Explain, analyze and evaluate common treatment approaches, including key concepts, goals of therapy, unique contributions and limitations of treatment modalities
8. Demonstrate knowledge of roots of human services as a career.
9. Demonstrate knowledge of legal and ethical standards of human service care.
