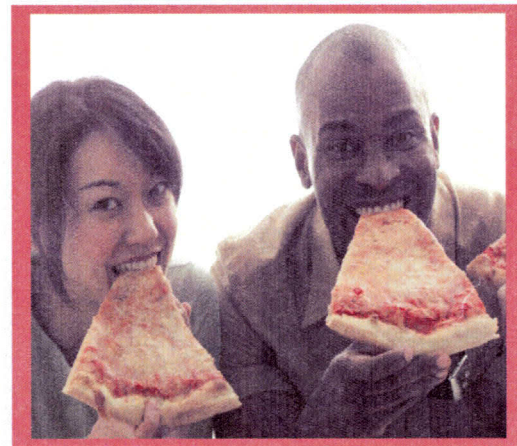

About Us
Publication of Archival Library & Museum Materials (PALMM) is a cooperative initiative of the public universities of Florida to provide digital access to important source materials for research and scholarship. PALMM projects may involve a single university or may be collaborative efforts between a university and partners within or outside of the state university system. PALMM projects create high-quality virtual collections relevant to the students, research community and general citizenry of Florida.

The PALMM Collections

- Archives Florida**
Archives Florida is a searchable and browseable database of finding aids (guides) to personal papers, organizational records, and other special collections held by archives, libraries, museums, historical societies and other agencies in Florida. It is a growing database as new finding aids and contributing organizations are added all the time. Finding aids are searchable collectively, or by individual archives.

- Aerial photography Florida**
Aerial photography Florida is a collection of aerial photographs taken between 1930 and 2000. Literally, a portrait of the State, the collection will be comprised of hundreds of thousands of aerial photographs documenting the land use of Florida over time.

- Big Cypress National Preserve Collection**
Big Cypress National Preserve Collection documents the natural heritage of the Big Cypress National Preserve, part of the U.S. Park Service located in southwest Florida. Photographs show flora and fauna including deer, panther, birds, hardwoods, prairie, mangrove forests, cypress stands and swamps.

If you (or your library) do not already have a YouTube account, sign up for one:

http://www.youtube.com/create_account?next (If you already have an account with Google, you can log in with that same username and password.)

Google Search Story Creator: <http://www.youtube.com/searchstories>

- Click the “Create your own” button (bottom left)
- This is the ~~hard~~ creative part. Think of the story or idea you want to convey, then decide how best to search for that in Google.
 - Some ideas: services, programs, books.
- Put each search in a different box and then select what type of search should be run.
 - Once you type the search in, you can then preview what it will look like.
- Click “Next”
- Choose a soundtrack
- Click “Next” again. (Your SearchStory will be created.)
- Preview, edit, and add details to your video.
- Click “Upload.”(You may be asked to log in again.)
- Once uploaded, you will be given several ways to share your video.
 - Also, your video will be added to your YouTube account.
 - If there is a lot of traffic on YouTube, it can take a few minutes to process the video, just FYI, be patient!
