Information Literacy & Research Instruction

Information Literacy is the set of critical thinking and reasoning skills required to identify, locate, understand, evaluate, use, and create information. –Information Literacy Competency Standards for Higher Education, Association of College & Research Libraries (ACRL), 2000

FSW Faculty Librarians teach students how to become Information Literate via Research Instruction (formerly known as Bibliographic Instruction), and by answering Reference Questions (research-driven queries) at the Reference Desk.

ACRL's Information Literacy Competency Standards for Higher Education (2000)

Standard 1: Determine the type and extent of information needed

Standard 2: Effectively and efficiently access needed information

Standard 3: Critically evaluate information and its sources, and incorporate selected information into knowledge base and value system

Standard 4: Individually and collaboratively use information to accomplish a specific purpose

Standard 5: Understand the social, economic, ethical, and legal issues connected to accessing, using, and creating information

ACRL Framework for Information Literacy for Higher Education (2015)

- Research prompts students to ask increasingly complex questions, the answers to which open up additional lines of inquiry.
- Research requires students to cultivate “the mental flexibility to pursue alternate avenues as new understanding develops.”
- Information resource selection reflects a student’s capacity to think critically.
- Students increasingly play a greater role in creating new knowledge, in understanding the changing dynamics of the world of information, and in ethically using information as scholarship.
- Faculty have a greater responsibility (in the Digital Age) to incorporate information literacy into their curricula and assessments.

Project Information Literacy: A National Study about College Students' Research Dispositions

- Surveying 13,000+ millennial students at over 60 public and private U.S. colleges and universities since 2008 to learn how today' students conceptualize, problematize, and use information for their courses and in their personal lives. PIL was launched by Dr. Alison Head, Associate Professor at the Information School, University of Washington.
- Most students use the same small set of resources regardless of their information need.
- 84% say getting started is the most difficult part of doing research.
- 80% don't ask librarians for help.
- 50% report feeling "nagging uncertainties" about the quality of their research.
- **12 adjectives students use to describe how they feel about research assignments:** fear, angst, tired, dread, excited, anxious, annoyed, stressed, disgusted, intrigued, confused, and overwhelmed.

Project Information Literacy Continued

“Finding and using information is exponentially more complex than it was a generation ago as the information landscape has shifted from one of [relative] scarcity to abundance and overload...the abundance of information technology devices and the proliferation of digital information resources have made conducting research paradoxical: information may be as limitless as the universe, yet defining and narrowing inquiries and finding relevant and accurate answers is one of the most difficult and frustrating challenges college students face today...[this] paradox affects almost everyone” (Head, 2013, p.p. 473-476).

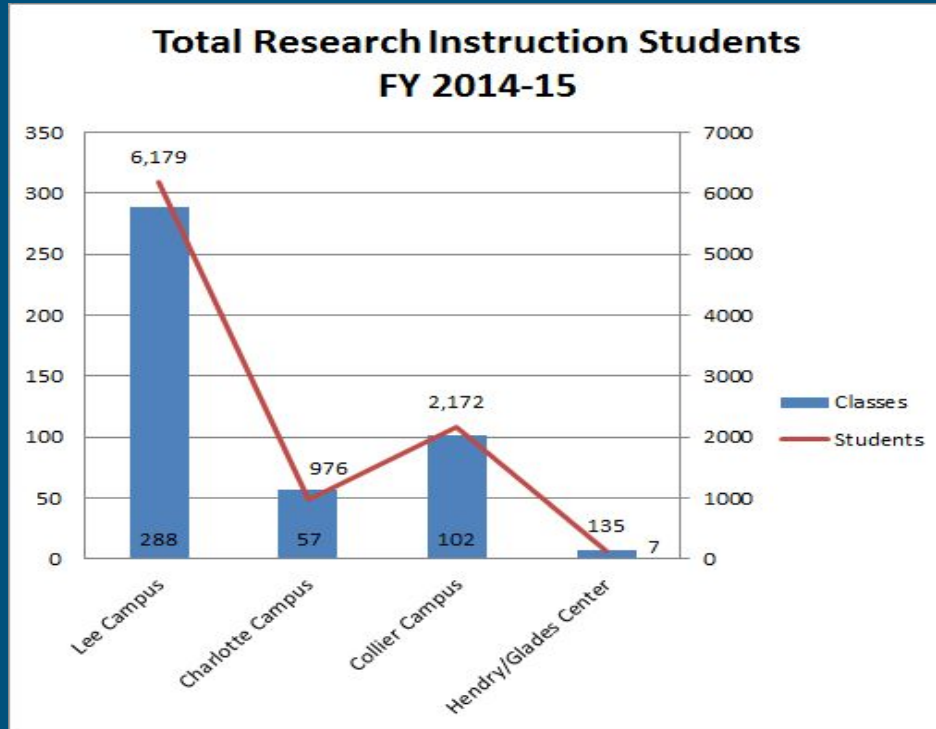
General Education & Information Literacy

- **Research and examine academic and non-academic information, resources, and evidence.** Understand how scholars across all academic disciplines investigate and speak to the human condition. Conduct in-depth, reflective, and ethical research about the dynamics of the human condition and the physical world in order to acquire information literacy, refine critical thinking and analytical skills, and sharpen intellectual focus. Effectively locate, interpret, manage, and use information and evidence from academic and non-academic sources in order to create original projects that engender meaningful learning in the classroom and beyond.

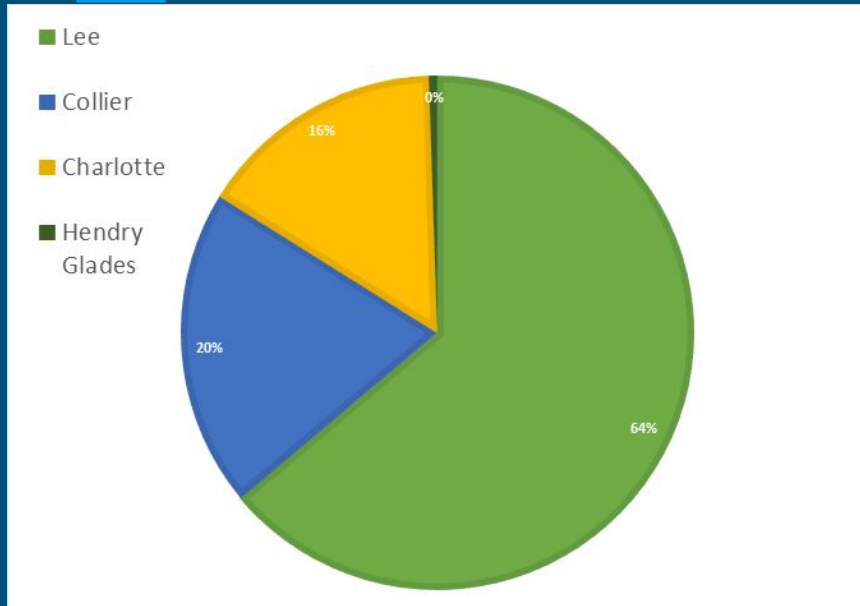
The Learning Objectives of FSW Faculty Librarians are to Teach Students to:

- Question Authority

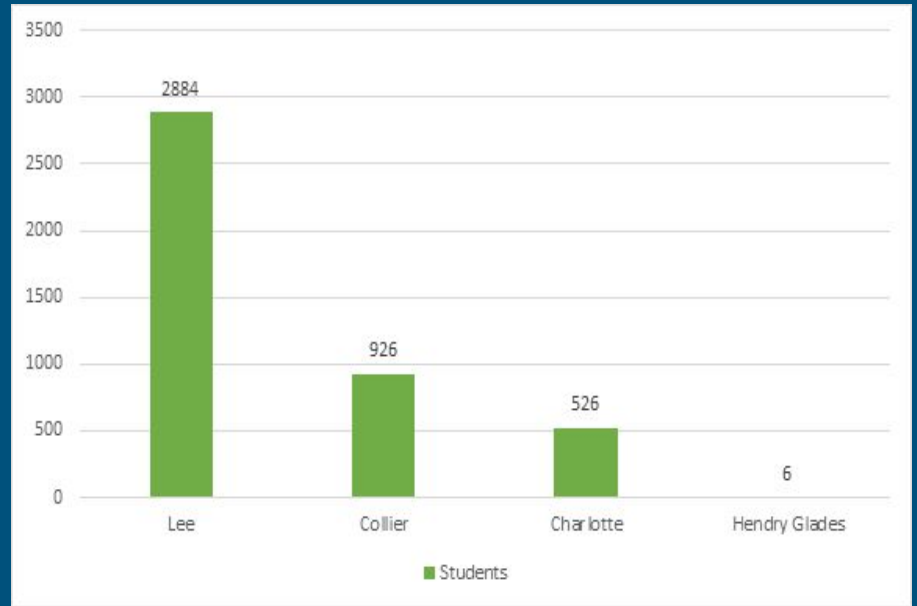
Research Instruction 2014-2015

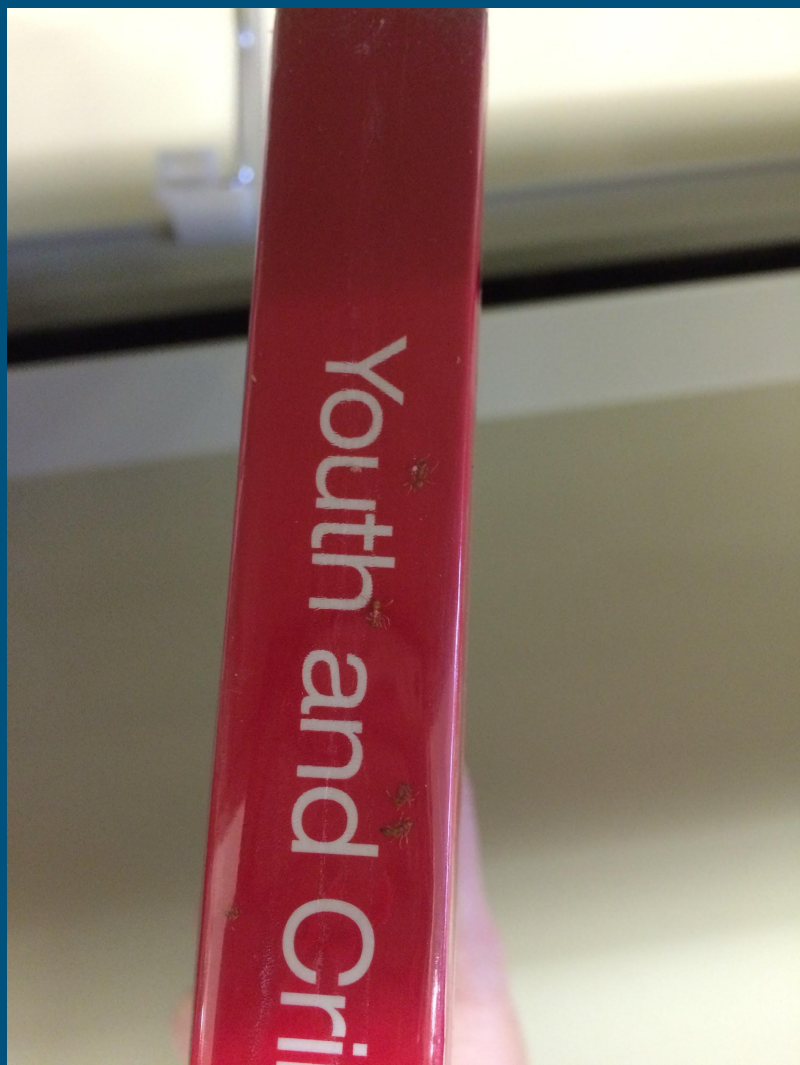
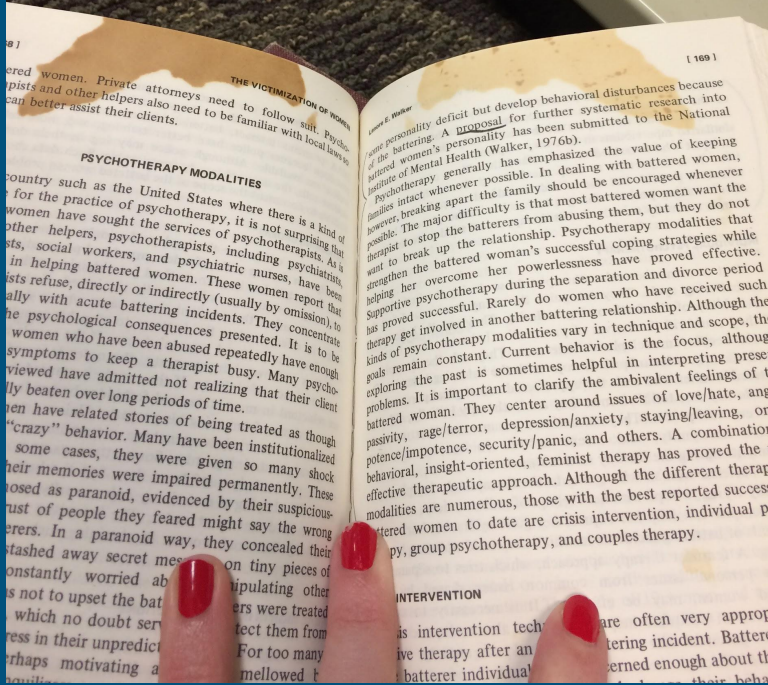
Collection Management

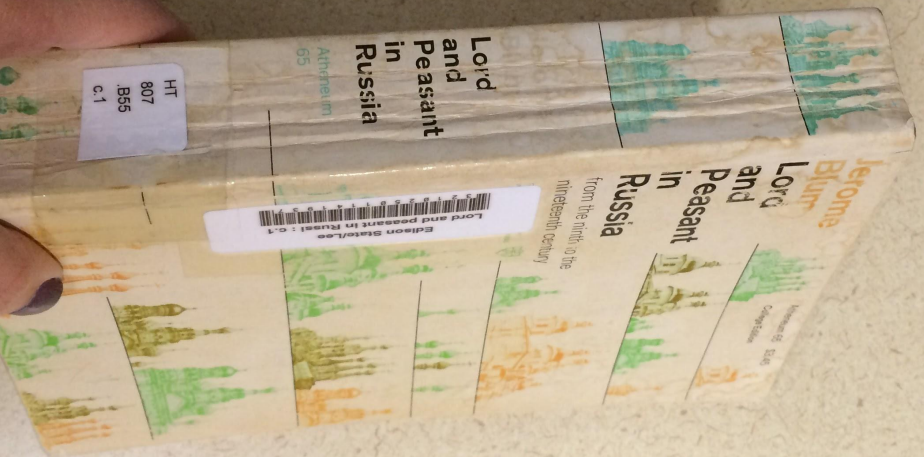
- deselecting and maintaining resources in the FSW Libraries

Deselection Criteria

- Physical condition (worn, stained, torn, etc.)
- Relevancy (both to the specific discipline and our college curricula)
- Age
- Duplication
- Superseded by new edition
- Circulation statistics (how many times has the title been checked out?)

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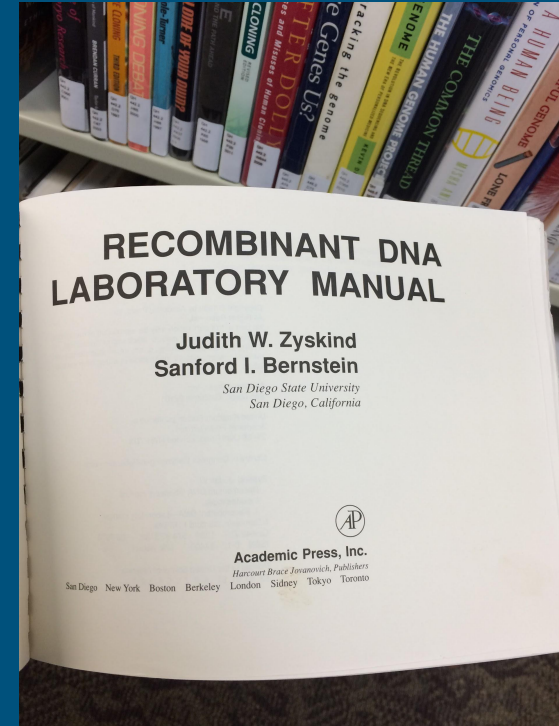
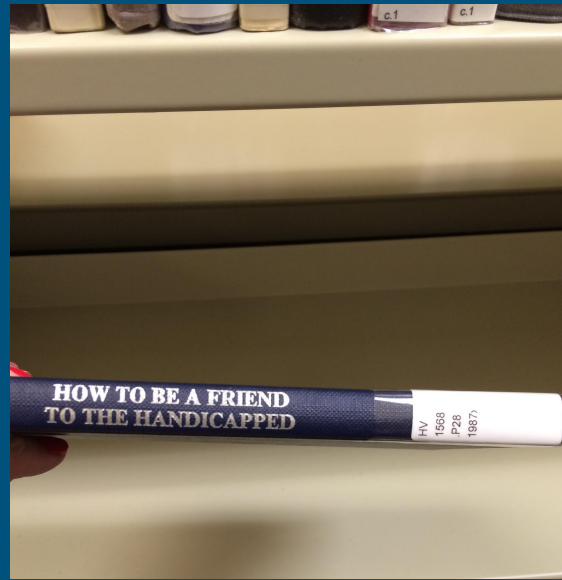
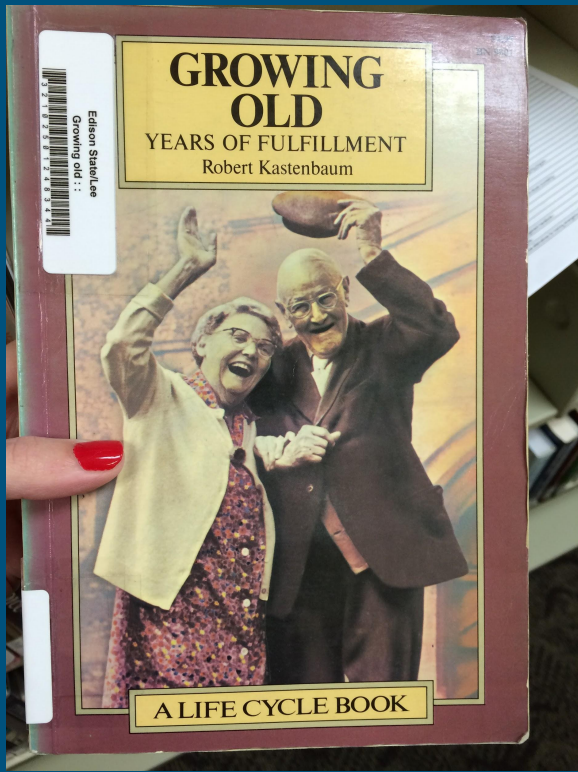
