The School of Health Professions proposes a change to the AS, Nursing program. The required entrance exam has changed from the HESI to the TEAS test, the required math will change from Any General Education Math to STA 2023 Statistical Methods I to align with the common course requirement for the RN to BSN degree, the required Anatomy and Physiology I and II will now include either BSC 1085C or BSC 1093C and BSC 1086C or BSC 1094C, respectively. There are also a number of new courses being added to and removed from the program Core requirements. The faculty and nursing administrators have unanimously agreed to convert from a Systems-based to a Concept-based curriculum. The statewide articulation of LPN credits will be adjusted accordingly, waiving 10 of the 14 Program Specific credits if a current LPN license has been issued within three years prior to their enrollment in the Nursing program. The LPN and Entry level students will complete the same Nursing/NUR core Concept-based curriculum (42 credits). The 4 Phases of the admissions process have been described as well as the Academic Policy and Progression criteria in the supporting documents. Changes to the math requirement will be effective with the October, 2016 application cycle for Spring 2017 program start to allow students in the pipeline ample time to meet the new Math Requirement.
