




<p>The School of Health Professions proposes a change to <i>HIM 1000 Introduction to Health Information Management</i>. Prerequisites changed from <i>Acceptance into the Health Information Technology Program</i> to <i>CGS 1100 and HSC 1531 with a minimum grade of C or higher; SB 1720 Testing Exemption or Testing into ENC 1101 or completion of [(ENC 0025 and REA 0017) or (ENC 0022 and REA 0019)] with a grade of C or higher; or EAP 1620 and EAP 1640 with a grade of C or higher; or an eligible testing/course completion combination</i> due to a transition from limited access to limited capacity no longer requiring students to complete a separate application. Course prerequisites are needed to ensure student success in the course. Effective date is Fall, 2016. [This is a revision to Action Item 49 from the February 5, 2016, Curriculum Committee meeting.]</p>

NOTES		
<p>The School of Health Professions proposes a change to <i>HIM 2813 Professional Practice Experience II</i>. Changes include: prerequisites from <i>HIM 1000, HIM 2222, HIM 2253, HIM 1140, Permission of HIT Program Director</i> to <i>HIM 1000, HIM 2724, HIM 2253 with a minimum grade of C or higher. Permission of HIT Program Director</i>; corequisites from <i>HIM 2283</i> to <i>None</i>; and credit hours from 2 to 3. Changes are due to new Curriculum Frameworks from the FLDOE and to accommodate both the <i>A.S.</i> degree and the new certificate. Effective date is Fall, 2016. [This is an update to Action Item 37 from the March 4, 2016, Curriculum Committee meeting which was tabled. The revision is in the request for a change in the number of credits.]</p>

ACTION ITEM 4	Change of Program, <i>AS Health Information Technology</i>
PRESENTER	Deborah Howard
NOTES	
<p>The School of Health Professions proposes a change to the <i>AS, Health Information Technology</i> program. The changes include the transition from a limited access program to an open access program removing all limited access application and prerequisite requirements and the addition of <i>BSC 1085C</i> and <i>BSC 1086C</i> as an acceptable course combination to meet the anatomy and physiology requirement. Other changes include the deletion of <i>HIM 2222</i>, <i>HSA 1100</i> and <i>HIM 1211</i>, the addition of <i>CGS 2511</i> as a required course, an increase in credits from 2 to 3 for <i>HIM 2724</i> and <i>HIM 2813</i>, a decrease in credits from 4 to 3 for <i>HIM 2253</i>, title changes for <i>HIM 2512</i> and <i>HIM 2214</i>, and the addition of two new courses – <i>HSA 1253</i> and <i>HIM 2279</i>. Total number of General Education credit hours would then change from 18 to 19 and Core Requirements would change from 52 to 51. Changes to the program are due to updates to the curriculum standards domains and Bloom’s taxonomy levels stipulated by CAHIIM accreditation. [This is a revision to Action Item 55 from the February 5, 2016, Curriculum Committee meeting. Revisions are removal of the request to decrease the number of credits in <i>HIM 2510</i> and the addition of the request to increase the number of credits in <i>HIM 2813</i> to 3.]</p>

The School of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences proposes a change in Learning Outcomes to <i>ECO 2013 Principles of Macroeconomics</i> . Beginning with the 2016 fall semester the State of Florida requires a financial literacy component in <i>ECO 2013</i> courses as a requirement to allow dual-enrolled students to register for the course. The Statewide Course Numbering System (SCNS) has questioned a second <i>ISM 4220</i> course that was proposed by the School of Business and Technology. The proposal for <i>ISM 3220</i> that was approved in February is withdrawn.	
The current <i>ISM 4220</i> will replace <i>ISM 3220</i> on the catalog page in the proposed new <i>BAS, Information Systems Technology</i> program.	
The <i>ISM 4220</i> course will need to be updated to add program registration restrictions for two of the baccalaureate programs in the School of Business and Technology: <i>BAS SMAN</i> and the registration code for the <i>BAS, Information Systems Technology</i> that is created by the Registrar. Effective Fall 2016

RE: VPAA Information Item, HIM courses

It was noted during the April 1, 2016 Curriculum Committee meeting that three courses in the Health Information Technology curriculum needed to have the prerequisites changed from ENC 1101 to the SB1720 Exemption language listed below. Effective for the Fall 2016 catalog, these changes are approved:

HIM 1211 Electronic Health Records

Prerequisite change from ENC 1101 with a grade of "C" or higher

to

SB 1720 Testing Exemption or Testing into ENC 1101; or completion of {(ENC 0025 and REA 0017) or (ENC 0022 and REA 0019)} with a grade of "C" or higher; or EAP 1620 and EAP 1640 with a grade of "C" or higher; or an eligible testing/course completion combination

HIM 2512 Office Management and Supervision in Healthcare

Prerequisite change from ENC 1101 and CGS 1100, both with a grade of "C" or better

to

CGS 1100 with a grade of "C" or better, and SB 1720 Testing Exemption or Testing into ENC 1101; or completion of {(ENC 0025 and REA 0017) or (ENC 0022 and REA 0019)} with a grade of "C" or higher; or EAP 1620 and EAP 1640 with a grade of "C" or higher; or an eligible testing/course completion combination

HIM 2279 Healthcare Reimbursement

Prerequisite change from ENC 1101 with a grade of "C" or higher

to

SB 1720 Testing Exemption or Testing into ENC 1101; or completion of {(ENC 0025 and REA 0017) or (ENC 0022 and REA 0019)} with a grade of "C" or higher; or EAP 1620 and EAP 1640 with a grade of "C" or higher; or an eligible testing/course completion combination
