The Florida College System, Notice of Intent Approval Process gives a 100 day window to submit the notice once there is Board approval. The BAS will take students from the current AS to primarily a programming degree. Labor market statistics verify the need for a BAS in information systems technology.

The service learning model is different than an internship as it is specific to a required course and length of service would be generally shorter than a traditional internship. This needs to be faculty driven because it is part of a specific course requirement.
