- Added BSC 1086C or BSC 1094C Anatomy and Physiology II as a required course to apply to the AS Nursing Program. Effective August 2016, the format of the nursing admission exam, ATI TEAS, changed. The subject area Human Body Science at 7% has changed to Human Anatomy and Physiology at 21%.
- 2. The School of Health Professions requires that all Nursing students have personal health insurance throughout enrollment in the program. Florida SouthWestern State College does not offer a health plan or other services related to a student's health care needs. Proof of insurance, naming the student and dates of coverage, must be provided. For information

 Graduates of the Nursing, AS Program holding the RN credential are eligible to apply to the Nursing, BS Program. To make this transfer more seamless and to align the AS with the BS degree requirements, the AS will specify that a writing intensive Humanities course is required. This will prevent students from taking excess credits as they advance to the BSN degree and also satisfy

- Rule 6A-10.030 that outlines the college level communication and computation skills required for upper division coursework.
- Clinical Sites, across the SWFL region, are now requiring that students show evidence of personal health insurance. Effective with new students entering School of Health Professions programs, effective Fall 2017 and thereafter, evidence of current personal health insurance must be provided.
- 3. Added the evening and weekend schedule. We had this option on hold as we transitioned to the new Concept Based Curriculum. The Associate Nursing Evening and Weekend (ANEW) schedule will resume with application March 15, 2016 and start date of Summer 2016.
- 4. Added Gold Standard and Statewide Articulation language for the LPN to ASN Program (10 credits). Distinguished between the 3 year and 5 year periods from date of LPN program completion.
- 5. Effective August 2016, the format of the nursing admission exam, ATI TEAS, changed. The subject area Human Body Science at 7% has changed to Human Anatomy and Physiology at 21%. The program has added BSC 1086C or BSC 1094C Anatomy and Physiology II as a required course to apply to the AS Nursing Program so that students are more prepared to be successful on the ATI TEAS entrance examination. In the previous admission cycles, over 90% of the applicants had already taken Anatomy and Physiology II in order to increase their admission points for this competitive program.

Nursing, AS

Graduates of the Associate in Science in Nursing (ASN) program are prepared to become licensed as an entry level Registered Nurse (RN). The role of a RN is to advocate holistically for diverse patient populations and their families in ways that promote health, self-determination, integrity, and ongoing growth as human beings, integrate clinical reasoning, substantiated with evidence, to provide and promote safe and compassionate quality care for patients and families in a community context, distinguish one's professional identity in ways that reflect integrity, responsibility, legal and ethical practices, and professional growth and development as a nurse, communicate respectfully and effectively with diverse populations and the interdisciplinary healthcare team through collaborative decision making to produce optimal patient outcomes and manage patient care effectively related to time, personnel, informatics and cost to continuously improve the quality and safety of health care systems.

The ASN curriculum incorporates classroom instruction, laboratory, simulation education, and clinical practice in the care of diverse populations. Local health facilities are utilized for clinical practice, including community agencies, acute care institutions, long-term and ambulatory care facilities. Graduates of the program possess knowledge, values, skills, and compassion; all are essential for professional nursing practice in a dynamic and rapidly changing health care environment.

Degree Requirements and Program Length:

The ASN degree consists of 72 credit hours. These hours include General Education (16 credits) and Program Specific Courses (14 credits), and Nursing Core Courses (42 credits). Competitive applicants will have completed most or all of their General Education and Program Specific courses before starting the Nursing Core courses.

Prior to admission, applicants must complete the following:

- STA 2023 Statistical Methods I
- BSC 1085C or BSC 1093C Anatomy and Physiology I
- BSC 1086C or BSC 1094C Anatomy and Physiology II

Nursing Core Courses, on the Traditional daytime (Monday-Friday) schedule, are completed in a four (4) semester cohort/group sequence. Students who begin the program in Fall semester can successfully complete the program in 20 months. Students who begin the program in Spring semester can successfully complete the program in 24 months.

Nursing Core Courses, on the Associate Nursing Evening Weekend (ANEW) schedule are completed in a 4.5 semester cohort/group sequence. The ANEW schedule is not a part-time Nursing program. It will require full-time commitment but it will be offered on a schedule that will consist of online classroom instruction with labs and clinical rotations offered on an evening (Monday-Friday) and weekend schedule.

The Traditional and ANEW schedules for the AS Nursing Program will both require discipline and commitment. Nursing education is rigorous and must be top priority from first semester through graduation to be successful on the NCLEX-RN licensing exam and to become a professional Nurse.

Application Deadlines:

Fall Semester Start - Application due by May 15

Spring Semester Start - Application due by October 15

Summer Semester Start - Application due by March 15 (ANEW Schedule Only)

*Finalists will be notified within four weeks after application deadlines.

The Nursing program has limited enrollment due to the rigorous clinical education requirements for the program. Acceptance to Florida SouthWestern State College does not imply acceptance into the program. Each applicant must meet specific criteria which are listed in the admission policies. The Criteria for Admission Policies are available through the School of Health Professions Nursing office on each campus. Phase I: Initial review of applications is based on a calculation of admission points using completed prenursing course GPA, TEAS test score, and the total number of general education/program specific courses completed. Pre-admission standardized examination includes the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS).

Phase II: At the applicant's expense, a college-approved criminal records check and drug testing must be completed. Note that applicants should consult Florida Board of Nursing if they have any criminal offenses, beyond minor traffic violations, which may limit obtaining Registered Nurse (RN) licensure.

Phase III: In this phase, applicants will participate in a panel interview to assess written, verbal, and interpersonal skills.

Phase IV: Selected applicants will receive a letter of acceptance. The letter will include information for accessing the Nursing Program Policy & Procedures and Virtual Orientation. The student must submit an affidavit of acknowledgement, acceptance and compliance of the Nursing Program Policy & Procedures before the College Drop/Add Deadline.

At the applicant's expense, the following items must be completed before the College Drop/Add Deadline:

- Health Form
- Immunizations
- Screening for tuberculosis (TB)
- Certification in American Heart Association Basic Life Support for Healthcare Professionals (CPR and AED)
- Proof of personal health insurance throughout enrollment in the program, naming the student and dates of coverage

Academic Policy and Progression Criteria:

The academic standards in the Nursing program are very rigorous and require full-time commitment.

- A grade of C or higher must be earned in General Education (16 credits) and Program Specific (14 credits) courses.
- A minimum percent score of 77% must be earned in each Nursing/NUR course (42 credits) in order to progress in the program.
- A score of less than 77% earned in a Nursing/NUR course will require a reattempt. A
 Nursing/NUR course may be repeated or reattempted only once, as determined by space
 availability. If a minimum percent score of 77% is not achieved when the course is repeated or
 reattempted, dismissal from the program will result.
- If a minimum percent score of 77% is not achieved or Withdrawal/W grade occurs in two or more Nursing/NUR courses, dismissal from the program will result.
- Dismissal from the Nursing Program will occur if a student is deemed unsafe or unprofessional in clinical practice/patient care.
- The Academic Review Committee (ARC) will evaluate each student who is unsuccessful in a course or has an interruption in their program sequence. Each student case will be individually addressed.
- The program will accommodate students with appropriate clinical training within clinical site
 availability and programmatic requirements. However, admission to the program and
 completion of the curriculum does not guarantee placement at all clinical training sites.
- Admission to the program and completion of the curriculum does not guarantee the award of RN licensure by the Board of Nursing.
- Attendance and punctuality is mandatory for all classroom, laboratory, and clinical activities. For
 every classroom or lab course, the third and each subsequent absence and/or partial absence
 will result in a 5-point deduction from the final course grade. Attendance (100%) is required for
 all simulation and clinical activities.

Florida Department of Education Gold Standard and Statewide Articulation Agreements:

The Gold Standard Career Pathways Statewide Articulation Agreement guarantees the minimum award of course credits or a block of credit toward the AS Nursing program is 10 credit hours. The Licensed Practical Nurse certification, or National Licensed Practical Nurse (NCLEX-PN) certification represents industry acknowledgement of technical skill attainment of competencies in the Nursing (Associate Degree) R.N. program. The student must show evidence of their current Licensed Practical Nurse certification, or National Licensed Practical Nurse (NCLEX-PN) certification and it must have been issued within three (3) years prior to their enrollment in the program.

Per the statewide articulation agreement, if the Practical Nursing program was completed in Florida and the student holds current Florida licensure as a Practical Nurse, then the 10 credit hours may be articulated within five (5) years of their LPN program completion date.

RN to BSN Nursing Career Ladder:

Credits earned in the ASN program will count towards the related baccalaureate Nursing degree completion (RN to BSN) program under the provisions of Florida Rule 6A-10.024. This creates a career ladder so that students can proceed toward their educational objectives as rapidly as their circumstances permit. Please note that ASN graduates will be required to complete all General Education, Program Specific Courses, Foreign Language competence, and earn the Florida Registered Nursing RN credential before admission to the RN to BSN program at FSW. For more information, please refer to the RN to BSN Program of Study.

Admission Requirements: Students entering the Associate in Applied Science and or the Associate in Science Program in <u>Registered Nursing</u> must have a standard high school diploma or its equivalent, or a CPT Eligible Certificate of Completion. Students must meet the requirements of State Board Rule 6A-10.0315(3), FAC (College preparatory testing, placement, and instruction). Students earning scores less than those listed shall enroll in college preparatory communication and computation instruction.

Other admission requirements: Students must enter the Associate Degree program within five years of their completion dates. Students must meet the college's entry, residency, completion and academic requirements.

Validation Mechanisms: Completion of a Practical Nursing program in Florida, and current Florida licensure as a Practical Nurse.

School district technical center and community college faculty committee met and agreed to propose that the <u>1350</u> clock hour program in <u>Practical Nursing</u> shall articulate <u>ten (10)</u> college credit hours to the AAS/AS Degree in <u>Registered Nursing</u>.
