The lack of foundational skills (aka soft skills) in the workforce has been a topic of increasing importance to regional employers. This is evidenced in each of the Workforce Now reports that examined local skills gaps, as well as in a survey of businesses undertaken for the Horizon Council. Lately, lack of foundational skills is a topic of concern illuminated by the efforts of the FutureMakers coalition initiative. As part of that initiative, the Southwest Florida Community Foundation is helping to underwrite and promote a curriculum to increase awareness in the individual of what these foundational skills are and their importance. To that end, this course is proposed to provide a vehicle to pilot one or more sections of the course using the resultant curriculum so that a population can be trained and then monitored to determine if there is a satisfactory increase in foundational skill level. This initiative is important to local employers and the longer-term goal is for this experimental course to evolve into a permanent course.
