Mission

The mission of the Social and Human Services Program is to provide the highest quality education to future and current Human Service Professionals with a learning environment that supports the development of culturally competent, compassionate and accountable professionals. The Program prepares graduates who are dedicated to the autonomy, dignity, and diversity of the people they serve.

The Addiction Services College Credit Certificate (CCC) is a shorter program of study that consists of select courses from -part of the Social and Human Services Associate in Science degree -pProgram. The CCC It is designed to prepare students for employment as addictions specialists and human services assistants, or to provide supplemental training for persons previously or currently employed in -these occupations the field of addictions.

After successful completion of the Addiction Services CCC, the student will be able to perform the following:

- Demonstrate a general knowledge and understanding of the human services delivery system and human services occupations.
- 2. Understand the importance of legal, ethical, and professional responsibilities.
- 3. Apply case management skills in real life situations.
- 4. Demonstrate a general knowledge and understanding of the biological aspects of addiction.
- 5. Examine the theories, identification, and causes of addiction.
- 6. Apply an understanding of treatment knowledge.
- 7. Demonstrate competencies of practice using various interventions.

Program Highlights

Many courses in the pProgram are available fully online (no classroom attendance) or offered in a blended format (occasional classroom attendance). The Social and Human Services Programs is an are open enrollment program; no additional application is required. The Addiction Services, CCC can be completed in 3 semesters. All courses must be completed with a grade of C or higher.

Program Distinctions

The Social and Human Services Program is a Florida Certification Board (http://flcertificationboard.org/) approved provider. Students who complete the College Credit Certificate (CCC) in Addiction Services will

simultaneously complete the training requirements for the following certifications with the Florida Certification Board or the International Certification and Reciprocity Consortium (IC&RC):

- Certified Behavioral Health Technician (CBHT)
- Certified Recovery Peer Specialist (CRPS)
- Certified Recovery Support Specialist (CRSS)
- Certified Prevention Specialist (CPS)
- IC&RC Prevention Specialist (PS)
- Certified Addiction Counselor (CAC)
- IC&RC Alcohol & Drug Counseling (ADC)

NOTE: Students who hold a baccalaureate degree or higher may obtain academic training in the Social and Human Services Program to earn additional certifications such as the Certified Addiction Professional (CAP). Contact the Program for more details.

Accreditation

The Social and Human Services Program associate degree is not currently accredited by The Council for Standards in Human Services Education (CSHSE); however, students will be eligible to sit for the Human Services Board Certified Practitioner(HS BCP™) examination after the completion of the AS program and 3-years of work experience with a minimum of 4,500 hours.

Attendance and Enrollment

Many courses in the certificate are available fully online (no classroom attendance) or offered in a blended format (occasional classroom attendance). However, there are select courses that require scheduled classroom attendance. The Addiction Services certificate allows open enrollment. No additional application is required.

Curriculum

This program offers a sequence of courses that provides coherent and rigorous content aligned with challenging academic standards and relevant technical knowledge and skills. All courses must be completed with a grade of C or higher.
