What's good?

Highlights from meeting with Dr. DeLuca on 4/9/20:

- Legalities of recording Zoom sessions
 - See Jason Dudley's verbiage about consent (DeLuca plans to resend his message in her update email today)
 - Students should not download and share elsewhere any Zoom recording
- Ideas for alternative commencement
 - Graduate will receive regalia accessories via mail; breakdown into several sections conducted via Zoom—students pics, name stated; drive through? Other ideas share here or email to Dr. DeLuca
- Late drop (form can be found on Registrar's page under Helpful Forms)
 - Can still use form if their reason for dropping doesn't fit the four options provided; be specific about why they need to drop; not all forms will be approved; college is in process of determining if a refund or credit will be issued
 - "I" grades used judiciously; only for students who have been in regular contact with professor and have a sensible amount of work to complete
- Budget reductions/FEE Grants
 - Anticipated that SU20 and possibly FA20 enrollment might be down; this will likely result in temporary budget cuts; Deans have been asked to not make large purchases at this time
 - FEE Grants have been put on pause; the grants that can still be pursued (that haven't passed or been cancelled) will be revisited once things renormalize
- Instructional survey coming soon

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- Not about evaluating faculty but designed to take the temperature of the f/t and p/t faculty experience during the transition to remote learning.
- Looking at this as an unwelcomed experiment where we can obtain data on strategies that worked/didn't work, trainings that were helpful/not helpful; gauge if we had to change our assessments, what we might use in the future as a result of this transition, etc. The goal is to better our approach to handling emergency situations should they arise in the future.
- Dr. Teed: Do we want a SOHASS meeting next week?
 - o General consensus—no meeting

Other:

- (Jacque) PSY 2012 repository w/power points, syllabi, lesson plans, etc. for any new faculty and adjuncts?
 - o Do for all SS courses? My reservation is that once uploaded the info would sit and become antiquated; will we commit to uploading updated artifacts?
 - Phil, Leslie, and Jacque indicated that it would be a good idea for all disciplines;
 Sheila indicated that we may already have a Psychology Canvas page for this (but only Psy and Soc spoke on it).
 - Will look into for Fall 2020 (or possibly Spring 2021 since faculty contracts will be ending soon for the AY 2019-2020. Leslie indicated that she would be around this summer to lead the psychology repository for those interested in participating.
 - Phil indicated that he currently saves files to One Drive/Cloud and shares files that way with others in Sociology.
