- II. Recent/Current Projects
 - a. Ordering of 2020-2021 supply of *21 Lessons for the 21st Century*
 - Dr. Teed and Dr. Schultz will meet on Tuesday, April 21 with Adam Davis
 - Coronavirus impact for fall
 - Print copies and distribution? Ebooks? Other options?
 - Prof.Porter: Video Conferencing conducive to book chats
 - Use of SLS fees to purchase books-may restrict distribution to SLS only students?
 - No SLS fees charged to online SLS students, can't use fee for them
 - Increase in number of online SLS students projected
 - Need inventory of books we have and of funding
 - Need to assess who /which professors will use books in courses
 - b. Ordered \$4000 worth of OBOC promotional items through Student Engagement
 - Promotional items
 - Prizes for competitions
 - c. Coronavirus/21 Lessons College Wide Panel Discussion via Zoom held April 1 at 11a.m.
 - The Battle Against Coronavirus: Lessons for the 21st Century, The Role of Leadership
 - 4 panelists, 128 registered, 83 unique viewers (mostly faculty and staff)
 - d. Before end of spring semester, encourage faculty to read book over summer, consider use in fall classes
 - Dr. Teed: having another Zoom discussion as way to encourage/remind/intrigue reading book
 - Topics for panel discussion?
 - Dr. Teed: Science perspective to get science faculty involved
 - Prof. Ransford: Consider science of vaccination
 - Prof. Ransford: Economics of pandemic, recovery of economy (growth/decay)
 - Incorporate communication with new book subcommittee survey for genres/themes?
 - Dr. Teed suggest to hold more ZOOM book panel discussions over summer
 - Dr. Teed-instead of leadership, look at role of "science" in Battle Against Coronavirus
 - Dr. Ransford-also, "economics" perspective of Coronavirus, recovery (math/economics)
 - e. Summer / Fall 2020 Projects:Fall Kick Off
 - Communication to find out which professors will use book
 - Tuesday, Sep 1 and Wednesday Sep 2 U-102 for any professor using the book in his/her course
 - Kick Off in 20 minute blocks
 - f. Continuing progress on:
 - Fall Book Chats, utilizing Zoom
 - Fall Media Chats, utilizing Zoom

 - Dr. Maetzke: media /local journalists panel to discuss how information is presented
 - How it affects people’s decision making
 - Information reliability, responsibility of consumer/citizen
 - Prof. Ransford suggested contacting Board of Trustees for connections or other information

III. OBOC Subcommittee Updates

- i. OBOC Selection Committee for 2021-2022 (Prof Ransford)
 - Names for SubCommittee: Bishop, Calabrese, Drake-Brassfield, Ginarte, DeLuca, Krupinski, McVannel-Erwin, Porter, Ransford, Rhyne, Rollins, Schultz, Teed
 - Suggested: SBOT faculty member needed
 - Student / faculty surveys for genres/themes to be sent out to faculty
 - Qualtrics survey would allow selection of genre/themes/topics
 - Would like to ask person to select in terms of general public, not just to that person
 - Send out to committee first, then send out to others in summer
 - To which students in summer and how?
 - Dr. Rollins-send to students in summer classes
- j. OBOC Film Series (Dr. Krupinski)
 - Dr. Mompoin and she have pushed Foreign Film Festival to Spring 2021
 - Will people want to sit in theatre (with virus precautions)?
 - For OBOC in fall, ask select professors to create promo video about film send to others’ classes
 - Professors could share, focus students, reel students in, create assignment
 - Professors could assign: Attend a film series, have questions tie into OBOC, then group discussion (maybe via Zoom), people from different disciplines to get more students interested
 - Discussion about how films would be available (Dr. Maetzke)
 - Dr. Krupinski: Need to be worked out to be equitable
 - Dr. Maetzke: Library has many films available
 - Dr. Schultz: Student Engagement has been making films available through social media, consider as a resource. Recent events have made more films available online (due to not being able to go to movie theatre)
