Fall 21 Admission Cycle Acceptance	 Due to the new proposed curriculum changes, the admission process will need to be reviewed for where ASN students are accepted. Sarah Gingrich discussed considerations include i.e. how and when do students get admitted, which courses are needed prior to admittance into the nursing program, financial aid implications r/t designation of major (AA vs. AS) Nov 6th 1:30-3:30 is the FSW Curriculum committee meeting to present the proposed changes. June Davis requested Sarah Gingrich to attend for additional support
	regarding student acceptance into the nursing program and sequence of courses.
Early Alert, Academic Writing, Academic Success Plans	 Committee discussed the current process. Committee discussed recommending to Dr. Voelpel the following: That the academic warning/jeopardy letter to be sent to the student after the 2nd exam (if their exam grade average is below a 77% (versus being sent after the first exam failure). Academic warning for exam 1 possibly if below 70 suggested by Shawn Steiner. Many students are at 76 and receiving warning letters. Further discussion with Dr. Voelpel for her insight and guidance. Faculty will still be responsible for submitting an early alert for all exams 77% or lower; continue to meet with the student; and completing an ASP.
Admission & Academic Committee Open Discussion	 June Davis brought up a student on Charlotte campus who is in academic jeopardy due to 3 "no call no shows". Student will receive a letter from Dr. Voelpel on Monday, October 5th.
