# Graduate Surveys

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- Goal increase return rate to 35%
- Return Surveys at 6.5% (2018-19 return was 15%)
  - Send surveys 6 months post RN to BSN graduation - October (Spring graduates), January (Summer graduates) & June (December graduates).
  - Send e-mail from nursing admin. one week ahead of distribution
  - Provide non - FSW emails to Assessment and Effectiveness Department
  - Follow up with phone calls to graduates to administer surveys over the telephone to supplement survey returns.
  - Revise questions on survey to make them easier to answer.

# RN to BSN Admissions

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Advisor with help of Administrative Assistant to track and reach out to students needing to complete general education classes before admission and creating advising plans

- follow up once a semester with students who need more gen ed classes
- assure admitted students have advising plan within one week of admission
- reach out to students who haven't registered 1-2 weeks until registered or changed entry semester – obtain reason for not starting
- reach out to RN to BSN student once a semester to offer service

# End of Program Student Learning Outcomes

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Although the goal was met, the sample size of survey returns was too small to evaluate program effectiveness on EOP SLO. Questions about EOP SLO were left off of Spring 2019 surveys with 8/28/2020 suggestion that Standard 6 Outcomes Committee review questions prior to survey being sent to graduates. 8/28/20 suggestions to raise the survey returns were adopted including:

- Send surveys 6-months post RN to BSN graduation - October (Spring graduates), January (Summer graduates) & June (December graduates).
- Provide non - FSW emails to Assessment and Effectiveness Department
- Follow up with phone calls to graduates to administer surveys over the telephone to supplement survey returns.
- Revise questions on survey to make them easier to answer.

# Satisfaction

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- Spring 2019 graduate survey – 4/4 responded they would recommend program to others when asked about satisfaction.
- Fall 2019 graduate survey – 4/5 responded they would recommend the program to others. 1/5 responded negatively when asked about satisfaction
- In summary: 8/9 (88%) graduates said they would recommend the program to others

# Student Learning Outcomes During Program (Pilot)

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Course chosen to measure – NUR 4955 Nursing Capstone

Ninety-seven (97) students took NUR 4955 Nursing Capstone: Spring 2020 (38) and Summer (59). Ninety-six (98.9%) of the students met the 8 Student Learning Outcomes, measured by course rubric. One (1) student did not meet the outcomes and failed the Capstone course and did not graduate.

# Progression

RN to BSN students will meet or exceed the Fall 2017 completion or progression statistics during 2018 academic year. (Progression results are behind two years in measurement).

# Success (Employment)

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Reached 128 of 135 graduates (94.8%) to inquire about working status. Of the 128 graduates contacted, 119 (93%) stated they were employed, active members of the US military or attending nursing graduate program. Nine graduates (7%) were not working by choice. Goal was that 90% of students who choose to work will be employed.
