	C. Discussed creating a new nursing major that allows a dual enrollment of ASN and BSN called AA- RN to BSN major – B. Holbrook. B. Holbrook presented proposal to increase RN to BSN admission – See slide presentation. Discussed eligibility such as GPA must be 3.0 or greater; must complete ASN Level 1 successfully and must have an AA degree or higher in Florida or meet all gen ed requirements for a BSN degree. Major is patterned after Polk State College Nursing Program AA to RN to BSN Major. Prof. J. Davis, Chair, will check with college Curriculum Committee to see if catalog changes can still be presented in spring to go into Fall 2021 college catalog. The advantage for students of the dual enrollment major is to get courses covered with Federal Financial Aid. Some students who satisfied the aforementioned criteria and taking NUR 3125, NUR 3145 or NUR 3066C as non-degree seeking students, with RN to BSN Program Director's approval, but these courses while being covered in employer reimbursement to employees are not eligible for payment by Federal Financial Aid. Faculty will support dual major if approved by Curriculum Committee. 6.	Outcomes Student Learning Outcomes	A. Survey Results – May 2020 six- month post – graduation – Prof. S. Torres – 19 of 41 respond 46% return of survey with faculty follow-up of contacting students who did not reply. 89.5% employed FT with 10.5% PT; 5% enrolled in graduate program. 95% said their role was unchanged since graduating. 89.5% responded they were satisfied or v. satisfied with program. Comments from students were reviewed by faculty. One comment was that we weren't allowing students to use clinical practice in the program. Faculty discussion ensued with the outcome to stress student can choose clinical practice as topic of many assignments.
