AS Emergency Medical Services Effectiveness Results Enrollment Completion Progression Course Data Success Satisfaction EMS 2119 Achievement 	 Enrollment Joe: The goal for enrollment was to maintain a headcount of 215 students for the academic year for the AS in EMS. We did not meet that goal. For the 2018-2019 the head count was 176. Enrollment data was passed around. Everyone: It could be because of the program changes. Also Hodges has an EMS program. Joe: We did change the program to become more selective. Everyone: We need to see how much Hodges is going to have an effect on our enrollment for the next cohort before we change the goal or come up with plans of action. Completion Joe: In 17-18 year we had36 degrees conferred 27.9 degrees conferred per 100 FTE. The goal was 36. We kept the goal the same. For 18-2019 we had 34 degrees confeered and 28.2 per 100 FTE. Everyone: Well we partially met the goal. Which is good. Now that we are being selective and the changes to the program more students will be on a better track to get the degree. Joe: We should keep the goal the same but compare the degrees conferred with the certificate in Paramedics. Progression Joe: The goal for 17-18 cohort retention was 55%. It was almost met at 51.4%. Everyone: Again we changed the way we are now taking students into the program so hopefully our issue with retention 	Yes / No		

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	becomes less. We need to see if the selection process makes our numbers worse or better before changing anything interms of our goals.			
	<u>Couse Data</u> Joe: The goal for 18-19 course section size of 22.5 was met, with average course section size at 23.8. Everyone: we could increase the size of the classes but then what about resources? Joe: Good point, lets increase it by 10 at first and see how quickly we can find a good number vs resource ratio.			
	<u>Success</u> Joe: Our goal for success rate was 90%. We only reached 88.63% over the 16 EMS course that were offered. Eveyone: We do so much hands on in lab, and obviously plenty in ride times etc. What about adding something to lecture? So that's it's a little more engaging rather then just sitting there listening to someone talk. Joe: Ok so lets leave the goal where it is for now and see if adding different kinds of activities helps.			
	Satisfaction In the 2017-2018 cohort, which was surveyed 2018-19 year there were 40 paramedic graduates. Of the 40 students, 14 or 35% of the students either confirmed by telephone or email in June 2019 that they were employed in a related field. Everyone: That seems very low. What else can we do to get them to respond? We should probably reach out to them more than just once. Joe: Ok so we need to reach out more then just once, how about August and November, almost a year after they have			

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		graduated and we also reach out to them 6 months after graduation. <u>EMS 2119 Achievement</u> Joe: This is a new goal we are tracking to just get some base line data and see if what we are gathering is even worth gathering. It course success data from canvas for Class EMS 2119 for both fall and spring. Everyone: Trauma is the weaker of all areas. But this is new data with no prior history to compare too so we need to see what the next year holds and compare it then before making any changes to the program in regards to trauma. One option is to have some trauma topics in the fall because it is mostly taught in spring.
