End of Program Student Learning Outcome

- ASN / BSN 6.1 The program demonstrates evidence of students' achievement of each end-ofprogram student learning outcome.
- ASN / BSN 6.2 The program's most recent annual <u>licensure examination pass rate</u> will be at least 80% for all first-time test-takers during the same 12-month period.
- ASN / BSN 6.3 The program demonstrates evidence of students' achievement in completing the nursing program.
- ASN / BSN 6.4 The program demonstrates evidence of graduates' achievement in job placement.

End of Program Student Learning Outcomes

- AS Program measuring this via student surveys low return
 - Need adequate returned surveys to steer program. (35-45%)
 - 9 mo post graduation
 - Aug / Sep (Dec grads) & Dec / Jan (Apr-May grads)
 - 2019-20 8% return student ranked good or better 100% of time
- Measure at Community Advisory Meeting –
- Should have students evaluate in Preceptorship class

- RN to BSN measure via student return
 - ▶ Need adequate returned surveys to steer program (faculty determined goal of 35% for 2019-20.
 - Actual was 8-10%
 - ▶ 6 mo post graduation
 - June (Dec grads); Oct (Apr/May grads) & Feb (Aug grads).
 - 2019-20 results 6.5% return, goal not met; measured 100% for all 8 EOP SLO
- Measure at Community Advisory Meeting
- Measure in last class in Capstone Project Goal was 95% or above. Actual achieved 97.8% Met.
- Have a in program survey given in last course asking students ranking themselves on achieving SLO.

Additional measures / Action Recommended

- AS and RN to BSN will need to start measuring SLO in courses before the end of program.
 - RN to BSN measured SLO in direct measure by a capstone project grading rubric. Will be selecting an earlier course for this academic year
 - AS need to have a measurement starting in the last semester that identifies the 5 program outcomes. Can be an exam question, project, essay with grading rubric
 - Last semester survey to students about to graduate

- RN to BSN Action to correct low return
 - Send surveys 6-months post RN to BSN graduation -October (Spring graduates), January (Summer graduates) & June (December graduates).
 - Provide non FSW emails to Assessment and Effectiveness Department
 - Telephone graduates one week before survey is sent asking to please fill out survey
 - Follow up with phone calls to graduates to administer surveys over the telephone to supplement survey returns.
 - Revise questions on survey to make them easier to answer.
- Suggestions sent to Dr. van Gaalen who agreed faculty suggestions are able feasible and their dept. will assist.

2019 – 20 NCLEX Pass Rates

- AS Program
- Goal: By the end of AY 2019-2020 the NCLEX pass rate for FSW AS Nursing will be 80% or higher.
 - ▶ 2019-2020 80.45%
- Action:
 - Changed Preceptorship course
 - Changing curriculum to population based rather than concept based

Program Completion

- AS Nursing Program
- Fall 2017 / Spring 2018 cohorts
 - 2 years behind for results
 - Graduated Fall 19 or Spring 20
 - Admitted 88 students Fall 17 and 157 in Spring 18 total of 245.
 - Graduated 231 of 245 or 94.3% within 150% length of program.
 - ▶ Attrition 14 of 245 or 5.7%
 - Goal is 90% graduation Met

- RN to BSN Completion
- Fall 17 / Spring 18 / Summer 18
 - 2-3 years behind because we had a 6 sem track (150% 9 sem)
 - Admitted 143 students
 - 123 graduated in 150% length of program (3 tracks – 2,4,6 sem) or 86% Goal 80% will graduate in 150% length of program. Goal met.
 - Graduated at any length 124/143 or 86.7%
 - ► Attrition 19/143 or 13.3%

Program Outcome - Employment

Program Outcome - Employment

AS Program

- Is tracked only through graduate surveys. Not being tracked any other way.
 - What can we do to track?
 - Suggestions: contact major employers HR each semester; call graduates and ask; look at address on graduate RN license; check RN to BSN admission for program enrollment...
 - State tracking of this item return on investment

RN to BSN

- 90 % of those students who desire full time employment will be employed, in graduate program or active military.
- 135 graduates during this period, we found information on 128. 119/128 (93%) graduates were employed, in full time graduate program or actively serving in military. 9 graduates (7%) choose not to be employed.
- Goal was met.
