NUR 2310C Pediatric Nursing (4 CREDITS)

This didactic and clinical course utilizes a developmental approach to study the nursing care of the child from birth through adolescence. Emphasis is placed on wellness, growth and development, and the nursing care of the child with alterations in physical and mental health.

- Identify methods of preparing the child for hospitalization and procedures.
- Apply scope of practice for the professional nurse and appropriate delegation within the legal, ethical, and regulatory framework of nursing to the infants and children.
