3/5/2021 meeting notes:

- Professor Ransford noted that he answered reviewers' questions via email, and cited lack of experience with technology required to make changes to documents. He questioned whether changes made by Vice Chair Cid were adequate to address reviewers' concerns.
- CC Chair agreed that technological changes have been challenging. Group training sessions were held in Fall 2020, with ongoing training and help provided as requested on a one-on-one basis.
- VC Cid's role in OneDrive documents is to make minor edits and provide comments gathered from reviewers. It is the originator's responsibility to review and accept or reject the track-changed edits and respond to reviewers' comments by modifying the proposal and/or supplementary documents.

Summary of proposed changes and explanation of effective date:

Action: Prerequisites change from list of all sequential prerequisite courses to only the final course in the new curriculum: NUR 2092 with a grade of C or better.

Effective date is an exception to the Curriculum calendar due to an oversight on a previous action approved at 2/5/2021 meeting. NUR 2145 was Discontinued, and New Course 2144 was created as its equivalent by SCNS order, with DeLuca-approved Memo enabling action retroactively effective to 2020-2021 Catalog. On the New Course proposal, changes to the prerequisite list were also made. Because this change constitutes an Action, it was not covered by the Info Item/Memo and the Committee requested a separate Course Change proposal.

We request that the prerequisite changes on this Course Change Proposal be effective in Fall 2021, when the first cohort enters the new curriculum.

Syllabus with tracked changes and impact reports for NUR 2144 and former/equivalent course NUR 2145 included. There is no impact on other courses or programs, as this change is to the course prerequisites.
