Adjusting course requirements in Network Systems Technology AS pending SACSCOC approval of BAS in Information Systems Technology.

GE Requirements:

- PHI 2100 changing from *required* to *recommended* among a choice of "Any (3-credit) GE Humanities."
- ~~Removing SPC 1017 or SPC 2608 (3 credits), reducing GE requirements to 15. Replacing with +3 credits of open electives (Electives category) bringing total to 6 cr.~~

Core requirements:

- Adding CNT 1512 *Wireless Network Administration* 3 cr. [required for the BAS]
- Removing SLS 1551/1331 requirement; replacing with open elective "Any 1000 or 2000 level course" 3 cr.
- Cleaning up CGS 2108 and CGS 1100 language from last year's curriculum action:
 - Added CGS 1100 *Computer Applications for Business* and removed (previously discontinued course) CGS 2108 from program requirements.
- Adding CEN prefix to specified electives under "Any 1000 or 2000 level computer course."

No change in overall credits to degree. Catalog page with tracked changes and State AS Frameworks are appended.

For 3/5/21 meeting: *AS Networking State Frameworks Justification* document added to support the department's decision to move forward with the original proposal as planned.

Summary: By Statute, AS degree programs do not require SPC 1017/2608. SLS 1515 is a College requirement, not a program requirement. 12 FSW AS programs do not require Speech, and 10 do not require SLS 1515. 5 AS programs include 3 or more credits of open electives. The current proposal contains 6 credits of open electives where either or both courses may be counted if taken.

Also included in this document: State Frameworks for *Communication* for AS NST degree, and mapping to required courses CIS 2321 and CTS 2142. SPC 1017 GE competencies and CLOs are included for comparison and contrast.

3/5/2021 meeting notes:

- Dr. Myers summarized the arguments in the justification documents.
- CC member Dani Peterson and guests Dr. Bill Kelvin and Dr. Jennifer Summary represented Communication Studies faculty in presenting arguments to retain SPC; presented learning objectives for Speech and Public Speaking courses. **Chair requested a summary from Communication to post on Canvas Curriculum for future reference.**

- Following discussion, Dr. Myers decided to modify proposal to retain SPC 1017/2068 in GE requirements, and keep Elective credits = 3 (Any 1000 or 2000 level course). [Noted with strikeouts in proposal summary above]

3/5/2021: Proposal accepted with these modifications.

- Dr. Myers made final modifications to Proposal and Catalog page 3/5/21.
- Speech faculty are revisiting the CLOs stated on these two courses and discussing possible modification to include skills noted in today's presentation.

3/5/2021 meeting notes:

- Professor Ransford noted that he answered reviewers' questions via email, and cited lack of experience with technology required to make changes to documents. He questioned whether changes made by Vice Chair Cid were adequate to address reviewers' concerns.
- CC Chair agreed that technological changes have been challenging. Group training sessions were held in Fall 2020, with ongoing training and help provided as requested on a one-on-one basis.
- VC Cid's role in OneDrive documents is to make minor edits and provide comments gathered from reviewers. It is the originator's responsibility to review and accept or reject the track-changed edits and respond to reviewers' comments by modifying the proposal and/or supplementary documents.

<p>Action: Prerequisites change from list of all sequential prerequisite courses to only the final course in the new curriculum: NUR 2092 with a grade of C or better.</p> <p>Effective date is an exception to the Curriculum calendar due to an oversight on a previous action approved at 2/5/2021 meeting. NUR 2145 was Discontinued, and New Course 2144 was created as its equivalent by SCNS order, with DeLuca-approved Memo enabling action retroactively effective to 2020-2021 Catalog. On the New Course proposal, changes to the prerequisite list were also made. Because this change constitutes an Action, it was not covered by the Info Item/Memo and the Committee requested a separate Course Change proposal.</p> <p>We request that the prerequisite changes on this Course Change Proposal be effective in Fall 2021, when the first cohort enters the new curriculum.</p>
