THE NSION

Beginning in Summer 2021, the *Elevate Elearning Initiative* will convene with the purpose of creating an innovative experience for online students in which they will build the skills that directly support their academic success.

The motivation for this initiative stems from the work of the *Innovate Instruction Initiative (I3)* task force, which identified student preparation for online coursework as a critical need. Additional feedback was shared by faculty at the Provost's open forums that indicated the desire for FSW to offer or require "student training" before taking online courses to ensure they have the skill set needed and are aware of the expectations necessary to succeed online.

With these ideas in mind the *Elevate Elearning* task force will collaborate to create an experience for students that is designed to:

- Increase student's digital literacy skills
- Create opportunities for students to develop a growth mindset through self-reflection
- Increase awareness of support services available to online students (academic, technical, and health and wellness)
- Provide guidance for (1) navigating the online classroom in Canvas, (2) preparing for remote proctoring and (3) using other digital tools common in online instruction
- Establish expectations for participation in courses with online instruction
- Create a community of online students, faculty, and support staff
- Create a "one-stop shop" for online student resources
