





I like the solution Christy suggests for the AA Program Change proposal. This course will be required for all students entering in 22-23, after they complete the prerequisite 30 GE credits (including Comm core). Most in this cohort will not be ready to take it until at least Summer 2023. All students completing the course outside of this requirement should receive 3 elective credits. This includes students enrolled in Spring 2022 - at least Fall 2023. Class rosters can be pulled by the Registrar, or as faculty leader for QEP, Gus would be asked to provide them each semester.
