Chair of Nursing Program Reminds everyone final grades are due on Tuesday, Dec. 15, 2020 Plans to go to Lee campus once a week in Spring semester Grades Discussion: If a student did not meet the 77% in their exam, the grade is the exam average grade (not course avg. grade) Students need to meet the 77% average on the three exams The exam grade guideline wording should be included in the syllabi. The Policy and Procedure manual and syllabi clearly state that students must achieve a 77% grade in their didactic exams. ASN curriculum presentation delayed to Feb. 2021. - Announcement by Prof. Susan Torres that Sigma application was approved. We will have a charter coming in April 2021 with a chapter name and chapter number. Those interested in becoming a chair or committee member let Prof. Torres know. Thank you to all who participated in this effort. We're expecting all faculty to become a Sigma member.
- RN to BSN has a lot of projects going on and faculty is working diligently.
- Two proposals were made with Dr. Norman to change admission criteria. (1) Regular RN to BSN admission: If students do not have all gen. eds. completed, we will admit them into the RN to BSN program. As long as students have an RN license, they can be accepted into the RN to BSN program, and have them complete the gen. ed. courses while in the program.
- Students must complete all gen. ed. courses and satisfy all requirements before they can take the last course, Capstone Leadership course.
- This proposal was made because we heard from the community that some students feel it's difficult to be accepted into the RN to BSN program.
- (2) Proposal on <u>Dual degree between AS and RN to BSN</u> that allows AS students to take RN to BSN classes. We need to work on details and propose it to curriculum committee with a timeline of Fall 2022. AS students may be able to take RN to BSN classes in the summer or fulfill course credit load requirements for financial aid.
- The major is called AA to RN to BSN After the AS students finish semester one, with B average and higher, and other criteria they'll be able to switch their major from AS to the new major and will take them to RN to BSN. The classes chosen to help students pass the Boards are Pathophysiology, Health Assessment and Pharmacology.
- Worked with AS faculty on the previous evaluation and outcomes committee. Survey participation of AS students were very low. A suggestion to raise response rate is to have faculty intervene and contact the students directly and appeal to them to do the survey to increase the participation.
