III. A Life on Our Planet-Marketing

IV. A Life On Our Planet - Distribution and Purchase of books

- 500 print version purchased for students in classes with professors indicating incorporation of the book in spring survey
- Email sent to those professors asking for confirmation, few responses
- FSW Library's EReserves- 24/7 remote access for all students: pros/cons (cost, sustainability, distribution)
- \circ Keep in mind cost and distribution considerations for next book selection

V. A Life On Our Planet - curricular

- Since spring, majority of faculty are aware of new book, reception compared to years past mostly pos.
- Faculty PD-TLC sessions
 - October PD Friday idea: Panel discussion with faculty members in different disciplines who are using the book, have them share, at end of sharing session- ask faculty participants to make an action plan-how they could incorporate the book-Dr. Krupinski to pursue with TLC
