Janetta indicated that Hodges sent out mailers to Providers all over the State to ask them to partner with sending employees for training through Hodges. Discussed several options to promote the program to local institutions like Salus Care and Hospice.

She offered to add a testimonial to her Adjunct biography for her classes and to share her experience with the FSW program with students.



Historical Program Enrollment

During a four year period, average AY enrollment of students with degree code AS SOHS increased by 10% from 72 in 2017-2018 to 79 in 2018-2019 and increased 6% to 84 in 2019-2020. In 2020-2021 average AY enrollment decreased by 8% to 77.


HUS AS Degree Program

Historical Program Enrollment

During a four year period, average AY enrollment of students with degree code CCC ASRV, HSVG, and YDSV combined doubled from 2 in 2017-2018 to 4 in 2018-2019 and stayed at 4 in 2019-2020. In 2020-2021 average AY enrollment increased to 7.

Clinical social workers and mental health counselors are required to earn a master's degree, complete a required number of hours of field experience, and pass a national exam before becoming licensed. The AS degree in Social and Human Services will prepare you to enter the work force in an entry level human services position. Many students use this opportunity to gain field experience while continuing their education toward their desired field.

- Understand and facilitate screening and assessments to determine client eligibility for specific programs

Addiction Services

- Gain knowledge and understanding of addictions and the challenges that addiction creates for individuals and families
- Acquire the credits through the addiction track to meet the educational requirements for the Peer Specialist Certificate that is required for many jobs in the addiction field
- Demonstrate a general knowledge and understanding of the human services delivery system and human services occupations
- Understand the importance of legal, ethical, and professional responsibilities
- Apply case management skills in real life situations
- Demonstrate a general knowledge and understanding of the biological aspects of addiction
- Examine the theories, identification, and causes of addiction

Human Services Generalist

- Understand the importance of legal, ethical, and professional responsibilities
- Understand the risk factors that lead to human services intervention
- Examine the theories utilized in human services
- Display an understanding of treatment knowledge
- Demonstrate competencies of practice using various interventions

Youth Development Services

- Understand the importance of legal, ethical, and professional responsibilities
- Display an understanding of a youth development approach in community-based, residential, group home and other youth worker environments
- Examine the theories, principles and stages of typical human growth and development and the challenges of each stage
- Demonstrate a general knowledge and understanding of community characteristics
- Demonstrate a general knowledge and understanding of family dynamics
- Understand how current social issues influence children/youth
- Demonstrate an understanding of principles and best practices of a developmentally appropriate youth program

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
