Davis presented background: On October 20, 2021, the FDOE approved revisions to Rule 6A-10.02413, Florida Administrative Code, Civic Literacy Competency. The rule amendment specifies, beginning in 2021-22 and thereafter, both an assessment and a course are required to meet the civic literacy competency requirements for A.A. and baccalaureate students. Previously, A.A. and baccalaureate degree first-time-in-college students			

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	could demonstrate competency in civic literacy	
	through the successful completion of a course <b><u>or</u></b> by	
	achieving a passing score on an assessment.	
	The civic literacy course requirement can be fulfilled	
	by successfully passing POSX041 American	
	Government or AMHX020 Introductory Survey Since	
	1877.	
	The Florida Civic Literacy Examination is offered	
	through the FSW Testing Services. See	
	https://www.fsw.edu/testing/fcle for more	
	information. The FDOE recommends 30 days between	
	attempts; however, students can retest on the next	
	day if needed. Faculty discussed that the testing policy	
	is important information for our out-of-state students	
	to know.	
	Note: The FDOE anticipates entering into rule	
	development to add the civic literacy requirement as a	
	condition of A.S. degree completion effective with the	
	2022-23 catalog year. Changes in the FSW ASN	
	Program are underway to meet this new requirement.

Discussed the college policy on student being able to repeat a course three times. On the third attempt the student would be unable to withdraw after the 'drop and add' period ended. However, students are able to petition the Registrar to be able to	

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	have a 4 <sup>th</sup> attempt.	
	If the student has petitioned due to two or more Ws	
	or Fs, and was approved by Faculty to continue in the	
	program, any subsequent W or F requires a student to	
	petition again.	
	If students are dismissed, the students can reapply	
	(there is no restriction stated in the admission policy	
	preventing the student from immediately reapplying;	
	which they restart the count of Ws and Fs at zero. Ws	
	and F from previous admission and dismissal can't be	
	counted in a new admission period.	
	This is one more reason why we a student success	
	coach is needed to assist these students be successful.	
	If Faculty change the policy limiting the number of	
	times a student can petition after earning an any	
	combination of Ws and Fs, if the student has a	
	sickness in family or for self they student would not be	
	allowed to repetition.	
	If the student petitions multiple times, it doesn't	
	mean that it will be approved.	
	If student's GPA goes below 2.5 they will not qualify	
	for admission or readmission to the RN-to BSN

			When a student fails they can take the class again. If the grade is a C or above, the student can apply for "grade forgiveness" and if approved, the failing grade has an "E" on the transcript showing the failing grade but it does not get figured into the GPA.	
			ASN & RN-to-BSN is not consistent with rounding up grades. ASN does not round up grades, RN-to-BSN rounds up from .5 – for example: 89.5 to 89.99 is rounded up to 90.
