Upcoming Curriculum Changes:

 The AHIMA Curriculum standards have been reviewed and course content has been analyzed to determine compliance. The current curriculum adequately meets the standards.

- The on-site facility placement challenge during the pandemic was addressed through simulation and greater use of EHRGo and AHIMA V-Lab activities.
- STA2023 Statistical Methods I will be considered for the required math component in the AS in HIT degree. If adopted, it will be effective Fall 2022.
- AHIMA standards requires that students have a minimum of 40 hours on site in a healthcare facility or organization. Pre-pandemic, HIM2940 PPE III provided 90+ hours of onsite activities for students during their final semester of studies. During the pandemic this standard was impossible to meet. Simulation activities related to operations in a medical office were substituted. This substitution will continue through Fall 2021. It is anticipated that a reimagined PPE III for the Fall 2022 will be a combination of 40 hours on site at approved facilities/organizations and remaining course hours focused on simulation and other activities related to the HIM profession. Volunteer to host students for 40 hours each fall semester will be needed to meet this goal. Please let me know if you are willing to take a student 1 day a week for 5 weeks to provide 40 hours of on-site internship work. Email me at Deborah.Howard@fsw.edu.
