Minutes from March 4, 2022

- I. Feb 4 2022 Minutes approved at 10:02AM.
- II. *A Life on Our Planet*-Recent Events Updates
 - International Sustainability Panel -Dr. Cameron and Dr. Maetzke Feb 18
 - Dr. Schultz congratulates the panel, and emphasizes how great the transdisciplinary element was. Dr. Metzke and Dr. Cameron said it was a fun session and they enjoyed it.
 - Collaboration with FSW Dining Services-Universal Meals (plant-based meals) (Mar 2)
 - A lot of marketing, we had a pretty good response. The highest percentage of specials that were ordered that day. They were happy and will keep going with it. This week they will have a plant-based version of a meatball for National Meatball Day. Often it is staff and faculty who want healthier options and vegetarian options.
 - March 1- Daniel Beltra-Documenting Man's Impact on the Planet (#)
 - Student engagement put this together and it was very interest. Beltra is a photographer and it was a great presentation.
- III. *A Life on Our Planet*-Upcoming Events Updates
 - Social Media Contest- Dr. Harris and Dr. Jett
 - Dr. Cameron, Dr. Maetzke, Prof. Ivy and Dr. Piro will be judges.
 - TLC PD Friday, March 25-Lunch and Learn
 - Nixed the lunch, that PD Friday is going to be Flex. Dr. Trevino and Dr. Kelvin will still present.
 - Book Chat-How We Got To 7 Billion March 30-Dr. Ginarte
 - April-Wrap Up Event and announce new book for Fall 2022
 - We want to involve students, all locations, etc. Social media contest could be part of the wrap-up event. Use that as part of the culmination, putting practices into place going forward that they/we have learned from the book.
- IV. Transition to *David and Goliath* and Dr. Cameron as new chair
 - Announcements to FSW community about new book
 - Committee members are announcing the book in department meetings, etc. There will be some books at the kick-off event, which we hopefully want to have at each campus location.
 - Dr. Maetzke suggests an early, interactive contest to get students and faculty involved with the book. Beginning of Fall.
 - Have not made a full announcement college-wide. We will make an announcement on the Buc Bulletin the week after Spring Break.

- Ordering books ([Hachette](#)) / E-reserves (currently 393 E-reserve checkouts for A Life On Our Planet)
 - Ordered 150 books.
 - Dr. Teed put forward a budget request to support OBOC, \$25,000.
 - 20 books in the library, as well as the e-reserve.
- Book availability for faculty in spring for fall planning-when will we have books, how will we distribute?
 - Dr. Cameron says the email system worked best to distribute the appropriate number of books.
 - Feasibility that bookstore could assist in housing and distributing the books? Dr. Teed suggests we talk to Adam Davis, to ask if there is a way for them to go about doing the distribution.
- Qualtrics survey
 - Dr. Schultz is working on the Qualtrics survey. Perhaps a quick summary of the book on the survey to see if they want a copy.
- PD training after spring break?
 - As part of book announcement, what events do we want to have to promote the book with faculty?
 - Prof. Ransford suggests having something on the rotating photos in the FSW homepage. Could we have something about OBOC on the homepage-Dr. Cameron to discuss with Marketing
 - Design a poster for the new book for kick-off and announcements. Dr. Cameron likes the idea of having students design a poster or art for the book, something interpretive in the Fall. Good way to get the book advertised on campus.
 - If you want a kick off poster, this group should probably make it. Perhaps discuss with Dr. Wurst, Prof. Chowdhury, and Prof. Roes?
 - August PD Day
 - How much will be on campus for next year? Dr. Krupinski will see what she can find out through the TLC.
 - Examples of how book could be used across disciplines?
 - We have not pushed it to use in classrooms too much. How could we encourage this?
 - Prof. Ransford suggests film screenings to get people into it. PD session with discussion of the film. Maybe we can do some research into some films.
 - Dr. Maetzke and Prof. Ransford discuss how to summarize the book or to provide a guide to the book. Faculty could see which parts of the book could be used in their discipline or their class?
 - Dr. Cameron was thinking about something more informal. Scholarly conversations about the book once per month. This would be a way to showcase the entire book. Collectively we could do roundtable talks, maybe students could come and see how we address the book in a scholarly way.
- David and Goliath Events (Dr. Cameron)
 - Themes: diversity, inclusion, marginalized groups
 - Student/community stories of overcoming hardships
 - Strategies and tools people use to get to where one can succeed
 - Surprise Effect
 - Films related to ideas from book
