College Requirement: Cornerstone

Changes to the state rule 6A-10.02413 F.A.C. and 6A-14.0303 F.A.C. have necessitated a review of program requirements for all Associates in Science Degrees. In order to incorporate these changes without exceeding state mandated program lengths, the SoBT faculty reviewed the student learning outcomes of SLS 1331 (formerly allowed to meet Cornerstone College Requirement) and have found analogous outcomes in MAN 2021 with the addition of an assignment that requires students to develop a resume (see attached matrix).

By way of this memo, I am approving a change to the College Requirement to allow for completion of MAN 2021 to serve as fulfillment of the Cornerstone College requirement.

College Requirement: Cornerstone Experience SLS 1515

The Cornerstone Experience course at Florida SouthWestern State College is an integrative and interdisciplinary course designed to help first-year students acquire critical thinking and decision-making skills that promote academic success. In this course, students will learn about college resources and requirements, explore career objectives and programs of

study, establish relationships with mentoring faculty, and develop a support group among peers.

All incoming degree-seeking* students who have earned fewer than 30 credits are required to take and successfully complete <u>SLS 1515- Cornerstone Experience</u> in the first semester. Successful completion is defined as earning a "C" or better in the course.

*Students who are admitted directly to limited access programs are not required to take SLS 1515. This applies to students whose first coursework at FSW occurs after limited access program admission or to students whose first coursework after three consecutive semesters of non-attendance occurs after limited access program admission.

Change to:

College Requirement: Cornerstone

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**Students who enroll in and successfully complete IDH 2910 will have met the Cornerstone Requirement. Students enrolled in programs that require MAN 2021 will have met the Cornerstone Requirement after successful completion of MAN 2021.

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
