Post-meeting issues and resolutions:

- 1) Upon final review, the CC Chair noticed that changes had been made to the Course Title, Course Description, and Topic Outline as well. These are substantive changes that require full review and Curriculum Committee vote, thus should have been submitted on a Course Change proposal.
- CC Chair added Course Title, Course Description, and Topic Outline changes to the Curriculog proposal in field E [Topic Outline]. Since reviewers did not voice any concerns, we will consider these changes accepted with the provost's approval in Curriculog.
- 2) There are Course Title discrepancies between 2013-14 syllabus and 2021-22 (2022-2023) syllabus, and between FSW catalog and SCNS. The old syllabus and SCNS use the plural "Communications" but the new syllabus and FSW catalog use the singular "Communication." The current syllabus, FSW catalog, and SCNS need to be consistent. Dr. Teed verified "Communication" is correct. Asst. Registrar Tim Maricle asked to notify SCNS of title correction.
- 3) The proposed effective date = Fall 2022, but the Justification for changes implies that the originating faculty member may already be using the modified syllabus during Spring 2022.

The final syllabus (dated 5/6/2022) is to be held for the 2022-2023 Document Manager.

The Chair and Dean are reminded that syllabus changes, like other course changes, must be presented to Curriculum Committee prior to implementation and on the schedule set by the Curriculum Calendar. Exceptions must be approved by the provost (e.g., syllabus changes submitted during summer for Fall use).

- 4) Syllabus sections XI and XII contained specific instructions, information, and course policies. These sections are open for completion by individual instructors. CC cannot approve any changes to a syllabus master beyond sections I-IV.
- CC Chair reverted syllabus sections XI & XII to master format, removing specifics. Please consult the Vice Provost of Academic Affairs for procedures to standardize syllabus sections at the department or course level.

Electives (18-20 credits); formerly Additional Technical Electives (12 credits): Added MVK xxxx (titles vary - any MVK courses will count) and 4 MUT course options to allow students more choices and serve various pathways. MVK xxxx did not list course credits, only the maximum allowed ("up to 4 credits"). Range of 1-2 credits was added.

- From Any to Core GE Math no change to recommended (MAC 1105 or STA 2023)
- From Any to Core GE Social Sciences; deleted ECO 2023 recommendation and added Civic Literacy course recommendations (AMH 2020 and POS 2041)
- Course title change for SPC 1017 to *Fundamentals of Communication Studies* approved by CC 10/1/22 has been updated on this proposal and program page.

Common Core Requirements: Deleted category and moved courses to other sections.

- Moved CGS (Computer) course requirement to Electives list. This requirement has been identified as a major reason why students don't graduate, and students gain basic computer literacy skills in many GE and science courses.
- Moved CHM 2045/L and 2046/L courses to General Education Requirements, where they fulfill GE Core and Other Natural Sciences requirements that were previously missing. Chemistry is required by the FDOE Frameworks for this program.
- BSC 1010 & 1010L moved to new Program Requirements section and footnoted to 2 recommended specialization areas.

Course title changes for BSC 1010, 1010L, 1011, and 1011L approved by CC 2/4/22 have been updated on the program page and proposal:

- BSC 1010 General Biology I
- BSC 1010L General Biology I Laboratory
- BSC 1011 General Biology II
- BSC 1011L General Biology II Laboratory

New section - Program Requirements: 18-38 credit hours – simplifies degree requirements.

- Course lists merged from Former Laboratory Science Option (2 of 3 areas required);
 Biomedical Science, Environmental Science, and Engineering Options. Removed headers and updated areas of focus in footnotes.
- Removed Scientific Business option and all its courses, which had not enrolled.
- Students will now choose a minimum of 18 credits of approved courses. Each course is footnoted to indicate focus area(s) for which they are recommended. These 5 areas update the former tracks: Biological, Environmental, and Health Sciences; Engineering Technology, and Geotechnology. Recommendations are based on the Common Prerequisite Manual, admissions requirements for FSW Health Sciences programs, the Pathways Initiative, and ongoing discussions about developing a Geotechnology certificate.
- Courses that do not fit into the updated pathways were deleted, but many may be taken as Electives.

Electives: Extensive course list replaced with a list of approved prefixes. Students will choose 0-20 credits of 1000-2000 level courses with specified prefixes to complete 64 credit hours required for this AS degree. Noted: SLS 1515 will count an Elective. Post-Meeting Curriculog Updates completed to resolve remaining review questions, based on meeting minutes and Dr. McClinton's 3/31/22 email: 1) Course-to-Framework matrix revised to include all specified Program Requirements and General Education courses. The Dean/VPAA is aware that assessment of whether all Framework standards have been met will be somewhat difficult because students choose 18-38 credits freely from a large list of options. 2) Final changes to catalog page have been made and copied to proposal fields. 1) GE Core and CL requirements have been integrated into the AA degree and General Education Program Guide (GEPG), and the FSW GEAC restructuring of the GE Requirements will be applied in the 2022-2023 catalog. Dr. DeLuca has advised that BAS program pages may now simply state:

General Education Requirements: 36 Credit Hours

Refer to the FSW General Education Program Guide.

4/1/22 CC Meeting: SoBT/Dept. representatives requested matching language across the catalog pages for Computer Programming and Analysis, AS and Information Systems Technology, BAS. This resulted in redistribution of sections and credit hours as follows.

2) Lower Division Program Requirements: 27-33 Credit Hours

- Changes from "minimum of 42 credits" to "27-33 Credit Hours" due to removal of Electives from this section. **Electives** moved to bottom of the catalog page. Electives may include both lower division and upper division courses, so now specify "Any 1000-4000 level courses" with approved prefixes for 9-15 credit hours.
- Common Lower Division Requirements (12 Credit Hours) Deleted CGS 2108, which is no longer offered. Added footnote to CGS 1100 requirement re: CGS 2108.
- Lower Division Specialization Track Requirements (15-21 Credit Hours)
 - Programming Lower Division Track (21 Credit Hours) Corrected credit hours error: said 27 but only 21 credits are listed. Deleted "programming language" requirement, which included two sequences that are no longer taught. Replaced with two courses (COP 2360 and COP 2362) (+6 credits) comprising the C# language sequence that is currently offered.

3) Upper Division Program Requirements: 42 Credit Hours

Upper Division Core Requirements (24 Credit Hours) - Although requiring 24 credit hours, only 21 credit hours of courses were listed. ISM 4153 - Enterprise Information Systems (3

credits) had been mistakenly included on the 1/19/2021 5-year course discontinuation memo. A Course Change Proposal to reinstate ISM 4153 in the course inventory was approved 11/5/2021. The course has now been reinstated on the IST, BAS program page.

4) Changes to Narratives involving course requirements:

- Degree Requirements: Category titles standardized, and credit hours distribution adjusted.
- Requirements to Enroll in Baccalaureate Courses: Statements regarding completion of General Education and other courses prior to Capstone were reorganized to match other BS and BAS program pages. At 4/1 meeting, Department representatives agreed that: Before enrolling in CIS 4891 Senior Capstone Project, students must have completed all GE courses and 36 (previously 39) upper-division credit hours.

CC recommended that title of MKA 2701 Visual "Infomatics" be reviewed, and the term be corrected to "Informatics," as it appears in SCNS. There was dissent from members of the Business school.

A Web search shows "Informatics" in common usage, in university degree program titles, and academic journals. The most frequent use of "Infomatics" is in the title of two companies: INFOMATICS, and Infomatic Systems. Therefore, we believe that the field of study and title of this course are correctly labeled, "Informatics."

We recommend treating this as a typo on the catalog page and updating it for 2022-2023 catalog. However, the department/SoBT must determine whether this is accurate and necessary. Please follow up with Assistant Registrar Tim Maricle to express your preference. If changed, the course syllabus must also be revised. If treated as a typo, no further curricular actions are necessary to make these changes.

Program Requirements decrease from 30 to 27 credits. MAN 2021 is required for this program, allowing the deletion of (SLS 1515 or SLS 1331) [-3 CR].

Entrepreneurship Track deletes ENT 2276 (-3 credits); this track decreases from 12 to 9 credits. The remaining 3 courses cover the same CLOs.
