As part of the review to make sure that the Science and Engineering Technology AS degree meets the new state guidelines, SPAS has reviewed the degree and are proposing some changes that, at least on paper, impact SoBT. The impacts on SoBT courses is expected to be minimal since few students have graduated from the degree. Most students enrolled are pursuing higher science and engineering degrees; the rationales for the actions affecting SoBT are given below.

Remove this requirement from Core classes

"CGS 1000 - Computer Literacy 3 credits (or CLEP CGS 1077-3 transfer credits) or CGS 1100 - Computer Applications for Business 3 credits or Any computer course with a CGS, CIS, COP, or CTS course - 3 credits

Add these classes to Elective

"CGS 1000 - Computer Literacy 3 credits or CGS 1100 - Computer Applications for Business 3 credits

While computer science skills are essential for the modern technician, this class has been a major reason why students do not graduate with the degree. Students do obtain basic computer skills through ENC1101 and science lab classes, but still have the option of taking the CGS classes as electives.
