Exit Survey Questions

Question 1 prompt asks for agreement regarding a series of statements related to the program outcomes. Results are on the following page.

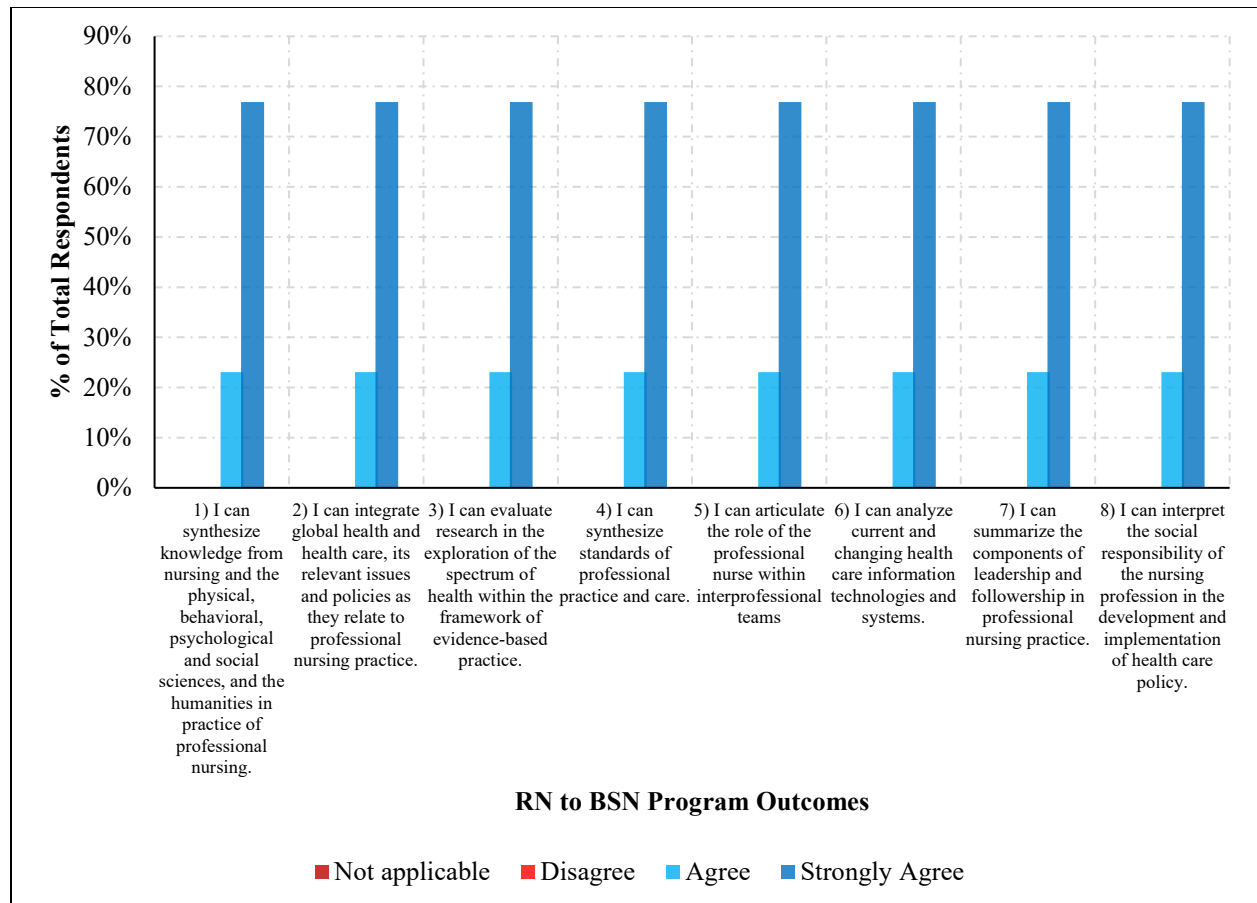


Figure 1. Response to survey prompt " Please rate your level of agreement with the following statements". Survey respondents: 13.

Question 2 prompt asks respondents to provide an explanation for their responses to Question 1 above. Commentary provided by respondents is shown below.

1) Outcome 1

Question 3 prompt asks for agreement regarding a series of statements related to the program. Results are on the following page.

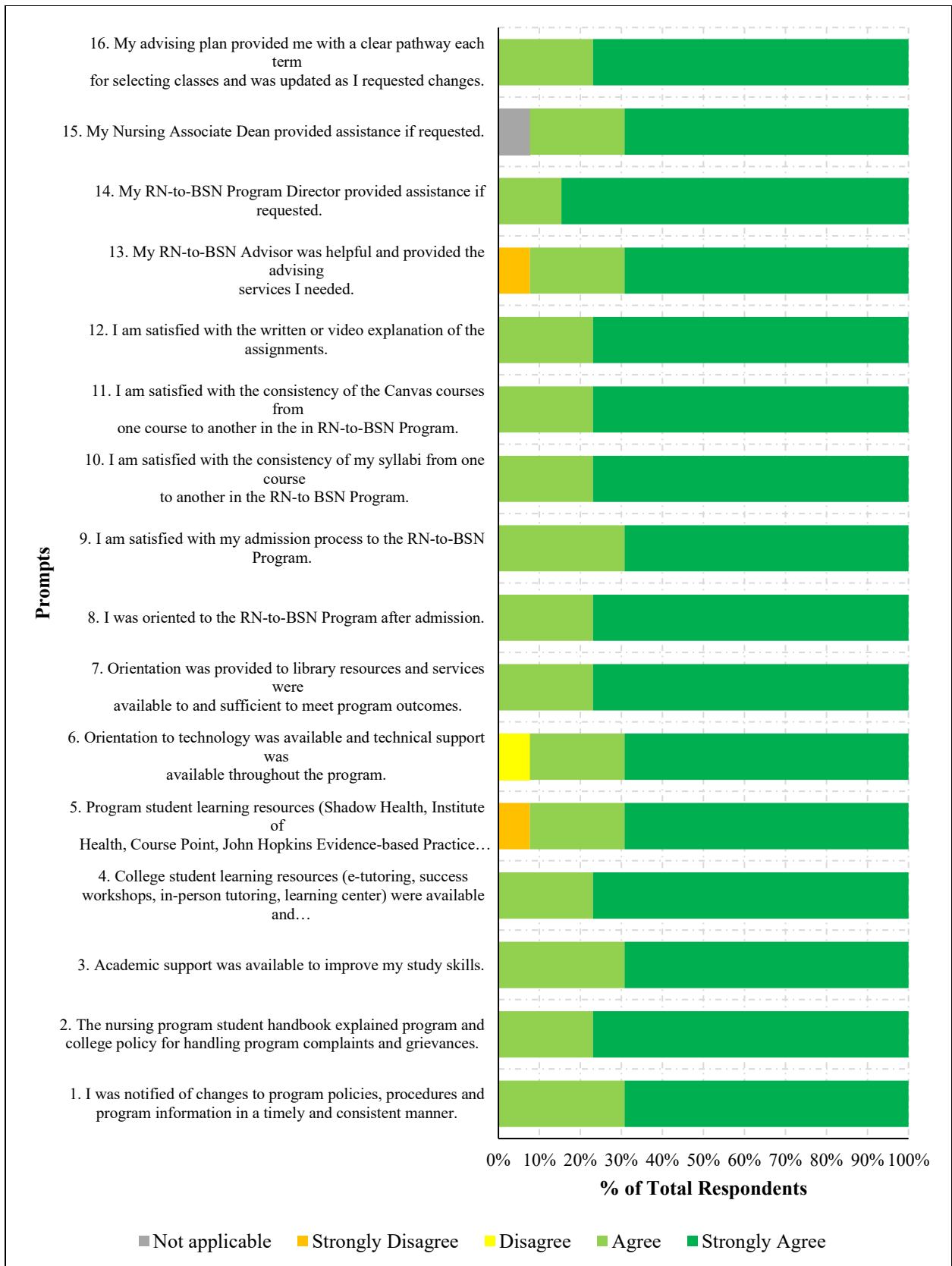


Figure 2. Response to survey prompt " Please rate your level of agreement with the following statements". Survey respondents: 13.

- 3) *The books and course point assignments for the nursing program should come in a package because it can simplify the process of obtaining required course materials for students, as they would not have to navigate multiple websites or make separate payments for each item. For example, multiple payments and navigating different websites to access course materials can be time-consuming and potentially distracting. It can be helpful to have all required course materials in one place for convenience and ease of access. This approach can save time and reduce stress for students who have busy lives outside of school, allowing them to focus more on their studies and clinical work. However, it is important to ensure that the bundled package includes all necessary materials for the course or program and that the cost of the package is reasonable and affordable for students.*
- 4) *I believe everything was up to par and was good.*

Question 7 prompt asks respondents to indicate rate their approval of the program and whether they would recommend it.

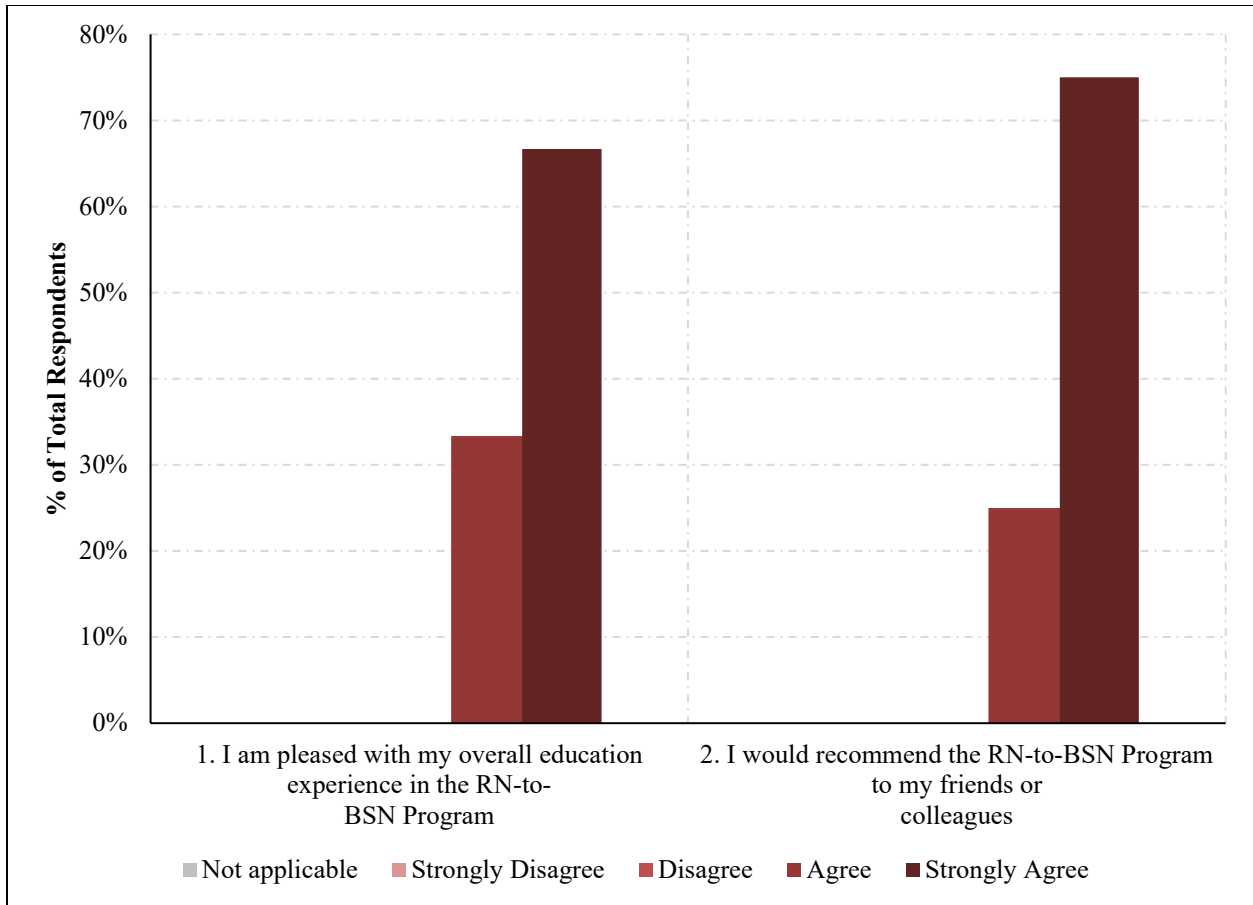


Figure 3. Response to survey prompt "Please rate your level of agreement with the following statements". Survey respondents: 13.
