Course Description: This introductory course is designed for the returning RN and focuses on the issues and theories related to current professional nursing practice. The evolution of nursing as a profession and the role of the professional nurse are examined. An overview of selected nursing theorists and professional nursing practice in a dynamic health care delivery system are presented. This course is available to students as an online course and a face-to-face-format that is web-enhanced, requiring students to complete classroom and specific web-based assignments and activities.

Grading Policy

1. Assignment Due Dates

- Students are required to complete all course assignments, including Complete/Incomplete assignments, to receive a final grade.
- All assigned work and projects should be submitted by the due date. All due dates and times are Eastern time regardless of student location. NOTE: Due dates for assignments are subject to change with notice.

2. Late Assignment Submissions

- Unusual circumstances may allow late submissions however, the professor must be notified before the due date, and obtain faculty approval for the late submission.
- Five percent (5 %) will be deducted for each day up until five (5) days past the due date for any papers, assignments, PowerPoints, and/or posters. Course work

received over five (5) days past the due date will not be graded and students will receive a zero (0) for the assignment.

- The discussion grading rubric has deductions for not submitting the initial discussion by day 4.
- Discussions close on day 7 and any late discussion post(s) will not be accepted.
- Students are responsible for ensuring they have adequate computer access to be able to submit all assignments by the due dates.
- Students choosing to go on vacation during the course semester are responsible for submitting all assignments by the due date.
- Internet access is required for all RN-to-BSN courses.

3. Incomplete Grades

- The “incomplete” grade [“I”] is given only when unusual circumstances warrant. An “Incomplete” is not a substitute for a “D,” “F,” or “W.” An incomplete grade must be discussed in advance with the professor. Students must follow the FSW Incomplete Grade policy.

Academic Integrity

Students are expected to abide by the Academic Integrity Policy of Florida SouthWestern State College as published in the current FSW College Catalog.

The nursing faculty expects honesty from nursing students in relation to performing patient care, written/electronic examinations, papers, care plans, and any other written/electronic assignments.

Examples of cheating include, but are not limited to:

- Copying test questions and/or answers by electronic or manual means before, during, or after the test.

- Copying another person's written work and turning it in as your own without giving credit to the original author (plagiarism). This includes not citing (paraphrasing) correctly and or using quotation marks according to the current APA guidelines.
- Use of plagiarism checkers, like Grammarly, to correct papers and/or assignments may be used; however, do not copy and paste from these sources as the results will flag as plagiarism. These programs are considered Artificial Intelligence (AI) applications.
- Two (2) students turning in identical, or nearly identical assignments.
- Submitting any academic accomplishment in whole or in part for credit more than once, whether in the same course or in different courses, without the prior consent of the instructor.

Use of Turnitin Reports

Turnitin is an online plagiarism checker used to ensure academic integrity with permanent storage of all submissions.

Student access to Turnitin for all written assignments is automatically built into Canvas. All papers and/or projects submitted to Turnitin must have a Similarity score of 20% or less. Students can access the Turnitin Similarity Report in their Canvas gradebook.

To understand the Turnitin Similarity score, review Interpreting the Similarity Report

- If the Similarity Report score is 20% or greater, the student may be given the opportunity to resubmit the assignment at the discretion of the faculty.
- An AI Score over 10% in Turnitin - Students should contact faculty for the course regarding any required rewrite of a given assignment.
- At the discretion of the faculty, plagiarism on any course assignment will follow the Department of Nursing Student Handbook and the FSW College Catalog's Academic Integrity Policy.
