<p>SYG 1000 Principles of Sociology</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ If taken prior to Fall 2024, this course will count as Core General Education. If taken after Fall 2024, this course will not count as Core General Education, regardless of a student’s catalog year. ○ Students may retake SYG 1000 after Fall 2024 for the purposes of grade forgiveness, but it will not count toward Core GE. ○ FSW has chosen to retain SYG 1000 Principles of Sociology in the “Other” General Education category for Social Sciences. ○ The updated statewide course description and learning outcomes found in the Statewide Course Numbering System (SCNS) must be used. ● GLY 1010 and OCE 1000 ○ Beginning in Fall 2024, any student may take one of these courses to satisfy Core GE for Natural Sciences. ● Math Pathways ○ MGF 1130 replaces MGF 1106 and MGF 1107 as a core GE Math course in Fall 2024. ○ Any student for whom the Algebra or Statistics Mathematics Pathway is not the appropriate pathway for their degree program should take MGF 1130 to satisfy the general education core requirement in mathematics beginning in Fall Term 2024. ● AMH 2010 ○ Beginning in Fall 2024, any student may take AMH 2010 to satisfy the social sciences GE core. ○ Currently under revision through a faculty discipline committee to add the competencies necessary for the course to meet the postsecondary civic literacy course requirement by Fall 2024. <p>Institutions will be advised as soon as that course has been added to Rule</p>

Summary of proposed changes:			

- In April 2022, a proposal was approved by the Curriculum Committee regarding the articulation of BSC 1085C. However, the language regarding this change was not reflected in the catalog.

Paramedic Career Pathway

To be eligible for articulation, the student must show evidence of their current Clear/Active Paramedic licensure. Upon program approval, verification of current Florida Paramedic license and review of previous coursework professional articulation credit may be assigned for up to 38 credits in the final semester of the AS EMST degree. All required general education coursework must be completed prior to awarding articulated credit and the AS Emergency Medical Services Technology degree.

Students with clear/active Paramedic licensure may have all or part of the following credits articulated as needed based on the student's previous coursework:

- BSC 1085C – Anatomy and Physiology I 4 credits
- EMS 2522 - General Pharmacology for the EMS Provider 2 credits
- EMS 2600 - Introduction to Paramedics 3 credits
- EMS 2600L - Introduction to Paramedics Lab 2 credits
- EMS 2601 - Paramedic Theory I 6 credits
- EMS 2601L - Paramedic Laboratory I 3 credits
- EMS 2602 - Paramedic Theory II 6 credits
- EMS 2602L - Paramedic Laboratory II 3 credits
- EMS 2646 - Paramedic Clinical Experience 2 credits
- EMS 2648 - Paramedic Field Experience 2 credits
- EMS 2661 - Paramedic Field Internship 5 credits
- APM 2999 - Articulation Paramedic 0-38 credits

Students must successfully complete a minimum of 25 percent (19 credits) of the required degree at Florida SouthWestern State College.
