MEETING MINUTES: Friday, January 9, 2025

1. Finalizing program learning outcomes for our AS degree programs and CCCs. Adam will also incorporate outcomes for the new AS and CCC Entrepreneurship programs.

4. Textbooks: The team discussed their experiences with textbooks this semester, and there are no reported significant issues except Bill encountered issues with a small publisher's book not being available at their preferred online vendor, so he sent them directly to the publisher. Alisa and Dorothy mentioned issues with some of their courses not auto-publishing on Canvas, which they resolved with help from Roz. Adam faced issues with design changes in his shells not sticking, but these resolved themselves by Monday or Tuesday. Lastly, the team recalled issues from the previous semester with Canvas messaging, where multiple messages were sent at once, causing confusion among students.
