Re-Opening Plan

- Today is the last day to get things from offices before clean-up teams lock us out – anyone who has not had access to their office and needs it, contact Dr. McClinton now (Lee Campus)
- Campus clean-up is ahead of schedule.
- I think all outside agencies are no longer operating from our buildings / generators etc. being removed.
- FSW Emergency response team teams re-evaluating their reopening timelines this afternoon.
 - Dean requests – Resumption of Lab Courses in person where possible
 - Access to office space in each building as they are cleared

Student Options: H - 22

- This will be the incomplete code for this term. Students receiving H-22 for their grade will be able to take the course again in the Spring or the Summer paid for by their fall tuition (i.e. free - will not be required to buy textbooks again either!) If they do not re-register for the course, H-22 will be converted to a “W” on their official transcript (not the normal “F”).
- Regular W, I, & late drop options still available – but students are encouraged to take advantage of H-22 option.
- If you do not hear from your students by Oct 17th, their grade will default to H-22 – they do not need to submit paperwork.
- Complete details in document I will send out with these slides, Q&A with VPAA to be scheduled very soon.



More H22 Guidance

- Will be available to Dual Enrollment Students
 - Might have bigger impacts depending on year and school requirements
 - Encourage them to reach out to advisors and counselors to work through best way forward
- The H22 designation does not impact a student's satisfactory academic progress (SAP) for the purposes of financial aid for this semester
- Will be lots of questions as the term progresses
 - Advisors are ready to help the students figure out the way forward
 - So far, all answers to questions have been in support of students
 - This is an FSW initiative as being the right thing to do – so all of the accreditation and state implication are being worked out as we go



Textbook Support

- I think we have coordinated any requests for lab codes or have them in progress – let us know if we missed some this week
- Textbook support for future semesters will need to be coordinated as we find out what is needed. Most publishers willing to work with us
- Students who need textbooks replaced due to storm damage who do not have eTextbook access can reach out to the bookstore. The library is also expanding the eReserves. Andy and I can help with that coordination.
