
F – Flex B – Blended K – Linked

For example, Section 101 is a traditional class meeting on Lee Campus, Section 901 is a Live Online Class meeting in Zoom, Section 30B is a Blended class with a ground component meeting on Charlotte campus, Section 90B is a Blended course meeting online, and Section 70F is a Flex course with the instructor at Hendry Glades, but a class that students can attend in person or via Zoom.

Instructional Method	Description	Location
FSW Online	In an <b>FSW Online</b> course all of your instruction and coursework occurs through Canvas, and you are not required to attend any scheduled class meetings. Instructors may offer optional synchronous meetings, but not require them.	Online Only
FSW Live Online	<b>FSW Live Online</b> courses are a special version of an online course where instruction occurs via Zoom during a regularly scheduled time.	Online Only
FSW Blended Online	In an <b>FSW Blended Online</b> course you will meet in a virtual Zoom classroom for some class meetings and also be required to complete coursework delivered online through Canvas. You do not have to come to campus.	Online Only
FSW Blended On Campus	In an <b>FSW Blended On Campus</b> course your professor will mix required on campus class meetings with online coursework. The online portion of the course may be live in a virtual Zoom classroom or all asynchronous in Canvas.	A mix of both
FSW Traditional	In an <b>FSW Traditional</b> course you will be expected to meet on an FSW campus on a regular weekly schedule.	On Campus Only
FSW Live Flex	In an <b>FSW Live Flex</b> course, you choose how you attend each class. You can opt to come to campus for every class, join virtually by Zoom every class, or a mix that fits your needs. The class will always meet together at regularly scheduled times, but some classmates will be attending virtually.	A mix of both

### **SPAS Course Refresh**

### For Course Maintenance!

- To help simplify routine course maintenance needs – too many courses to do all of these items every year
  - Master Syllabus
  - Textbooks
  - Master Shells
  - Assessments Requests
  - Concurrent course requirements
- Review courses on a rotating 5-year cycle so 20% of a department's courses annually

### **Course and Program Assessment**

### • For Accreditation!

- Programs, not schools or departments, are generally accredited
- We do complaint assist reports for three programs:
  - AA in General Studies
  - AS in Science and Engineering Technology
  - Certificate in Scientific Workplace Preparation
- Through Team AASPIRE
- Course assessments feed program assessment – 3 math/3 science per year minimum from these programs

#### AA in General Studies

#### AS in Science and Engineering Technology


The Associate in Science (AS) in Science and Engineering Technology program offers a sequence of courses that presents coherent and rigorous content needed to prepare for employment and/or promotion in occupations where a general knowledge of scientific and/or engineering methodologies is required.



#### Certificate in Scientific Workplace Preparation

The College Credit Certificate (CCC) in Scientific Workplace Preparation prepares students for entry-level employment in a science or engineering laboratory. It improves the student's communication, information technology, and math skills while developing basic scientific laboratory skills.








# SPAS Updates – SPAS Course Refresh

- Will align with the new contract for the course development process




### Steps:






