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		<p>B. National Rules on Online Programs – Regular and Substantive Interactions</p>	<p>Regular and Substantive Interaction: Background, Concerns, and Guiding Principle <i>Online Learning Consortium (2019)</i></p> <p>Regular and substantive interaction (RSI) between instructors and students is a core component distinguishing distance education from correspondence education. In contrast to correspondence education, where students are not in regular and substantive interaction with instructors, distance education is eligible for Title IV financial aid because of the presence of RSI. Although the statutory and regulatory definitions of distance education state, in part, that it must "support regular and substantive interaction between the students and the instructor, synchronously or asynchronously" (Higher Education Opportunity Act, Pub.L. 110-315, 122 Stat. 3078, codified as amended at 34 C.F.R. §600.2), the meaning of the term "regular and substantive interaction" (RSI) has never been clearly defined in either statute or by the Department of Education. As such, institutions offering distance education are held to a standard that impacts financial aid eligibility that remains ill-defined by the Department of Education and Congress. Although much of the recent discussion around RSI has focused on its application to online direct assessment and competency-based education (CBE), it remains a critical issue for all institutions offering distance education. It must be clearly defined in such a way that considers the needs of all distance education modalities and educational innovations.</p> <p>Faculty agreed to publish 10 office hours with a Zoom link for students to drop in during open Office Hours. 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		B. AACN White Paper: Practice Experiences in Entry-Level Post-Licensure Nursing Programs 2024	Dr. Wiener reviewed the Handout with the faculty. Discussed practice experiences. Bholbrook spoke with the ACEN Director on a consulting phone call – summarizing the phone consultation: -Leadership experiences count as clinical experiences. -NUR 4827C Leadership Course faculty must contact Preceptors at the beginning of practice experience and the end of student rotation. -Preceptors need to review issues with the Leadership students they are experiencing at the clinical site; the Leadership student picks one of these issues as a change agent project (final project) and lets the Preceptor know they will suggest this topic to the student's course faculty. The student researches literature on the topic, such as what has been written about the issue and what is being offered as possible solutions or alternatives. Students can discuss progress on the research with the Preceptor. The student will summarize the research and solutions as a voice-over PowerPoint presentation, which will be submitted to the course faculty. The student will provide the summary to the Preceptor once graded by faculty and corrected and revised by the student as a thank you for mentoring the Leadership student. BH and MW revised the Leadership Preceptor Orientation Handbook and Student Handbooks and emailed them to JS and HG. Items should go into effect for Fall 2024, with revisions being made for Spring 2025.
