






 Prerequisites: Demonstration of readiness for college-level computation, or MAT 0018 with a "C" or better, or MAT 0057 with a "C" or better, or MAT 1100 with a "C" or better, or any college-level math class with a grade of "C" or better.

New Password Requirements

- Best practices from CIS (Center for Internet Security) and NIST (National Institute of Standards and Technology) recommend passwords with a minimum of 12-16 characters with complexity rules and recommend using paraphrases, which are longer than words but can be easier to remember. In addition, password expirations are being phased out, unless an account has been compromised.
- The new FSW password will be required to have a minimum of 14 characters, up from 8, and the same complexity rules will apply (uppercase, lowercase, number, and special character).
- The new requirements will go into effect with your next password expiration after 9/1/25. However, you are welcome to change your password at any time using the password reset tool in the myFSW portal.
- Currently, your password expires every 60 days. With these new requirements, there is some good news, your password will now need to be changed every 6 months versus the 60 days.

What's New in FSW Ed Tech

Canvas Updates

Canvas has also released some new AI features that we would like faculty feedback on. The details are outlined in the updated <u>AI Excellence Toolkit</u> and faculty have the option to enable/disable tools in their course settings (see feature options).






