Beginning and End of Semester Procedures - Updated Phone Numbers Please!

As Andy continues to process all of the paperwork associated with the start and end of semester procedures, please help us out by checking your FSW email frequently at the start and end of the semester (at least daily if not more!) and by making sure either your contact information is updated in the portal or that Andy has a good way to get in touch with you. We never share your information, but sometimes we do need to contact you when things are not processed as smoothly as we all would like. Finally, please note that all approvals given to students (e.g. capacity overrides) need to be done in writing (a simple email is great) or to us directly – we do not take students at their word for such approvals.

Building the Spring Schedule – and Spring Schedule Guidance

We are beginning the process of building the spring schedule, and I will be reaching out to all faculty for input starting with the number of sections we think should be offered on each campus and in each modality. The guidance (attached) is that our full-time faculty should be teaching half of their base load in person (traditional, blended, flex), with a goal of 70% of classes being offered in a combination of these modalities. Surveying of first-time college students consistently show requests for in-person classes (particularly the math and science classes), and once they are in classes, requests for flexibility – like blended and flex options. Advanced classes and overloads are more flexible on modalities. I have consolidated the previous year's data as a starting point (course sections by campus), and plan to build the schedule from there. Please look for my emails this week and discuss/coordinate with your course and campus colleagues for input at the September department meetings as necessary.

Textbook Adoptions for Spring

Textbook adoptions are due starting September 30, so textbook adoption updates need to be discussed and verified at the next department meeting. Please note that textbooks are purchased on behalf of the dual enrollment student by various sources – so if there are required textbook options, dual enrollment students will be issued the option that has the lowest cost. Therefore, we need to be specific about the different options offered, particularly within the same course - otherwise, many, many issues arise at the start of the semester. Finally, please note that the system limits us to one official textbook per campus per course, with the only exceptions being for OER or official course pilots.
