IT Updates – ZOOM PHONES

IT has been updating all of the lines to Zoom phones, and the activation process began today (November 1). Once your number is activated, when you log into Zoom, you will now see a link for a phone. If the Zoom app on your computer or personal phone starts ringing, it is probably someone calling your office. If you are experiencing any issues, please submit an IT ticket immediately. I have seen it go live on Lee campus, but have not seen any official information on the roll out. And on a fun note, you can now receive texts and images through your office number and Zoom phones.

LEE Campus Building Openings

IT has been working to set up spaces for both students and faculty. Some will be open starting tomorrow, November 2. Please share this information with your students too!

- Temporary Proctorio and ProctorU space will be located in <u>Building A, Rooms 201/202</u>. IT is placing stations in there today and will add signage as well. There will be a limited amount of stations so please have the students plan accordingly.
- The temporary Zoom room will be located in A-103. Stations are being set up and IT will be placing signage in this space to assist in locating the room.
- Faculty that need a space to use college resources, such as Internet, can come to A/AA and use the TLC room: AA-168. The IT help desk is located in A for any technology support you may need while teaching your Online courses from this space. Headsets are available at that A helpdesk location if needed. We also encourage you to check out hotspots to ensure you have Internet at home.
- Lee Building Reopening Dates for Labs and Faculty Offices:
 - Building A/AA on November 2 for Lab classes and faculty offices
 - Building C on November 7 for Lab classes
 - Buildings H and U on November 14 for Lab classes and faculty offices (I am requesting an earlier date for lab prep time and will keep you posted!)
- Facilities is requesting that we use Lot 1 first and then Lot 2 for parking!
