

## **Summer and Fall Adoptions**

The deadline to submit adoption changes has passed. We'll begin entering the information for summer 2023 shortly. So if you haven't reached out to Andy yet, he is assuming there are no textbook changes for your course for that term, and that any OER exceptions in the spring will carry over into the summer. If there are any changes for fall 2023, he needs to hear from each course supervisor by next Monday, March 6, including a confirmation of any OER exceptions for that term.

# Summer and Fall Schedules – will email another round of schedules around March 6th

I have built out most of the summer and fall schedules, and scheduler is now adding the rooms. Once that process is complete (estimated march 6<sup>th</sup>), I will send out another round of confirmation emails. There were a lot of moving pieces getting this schedule together and multiple people inputting the information into Banner, so please help me do a good quality control check on days/times and modalities before the schedule is visible to students March 10th.

#### Evaluation Forms – All are due the end of the Month!

Now that the schedule is almost complete, I am working my way through evaluation forms and portfolios – I will continue to reach out to you all over the next two weeks to finalize everything.

#### New Leave Request Process - PLEASE READ IN DETAIL...

There is a new leave request and reporting process that affects all exempt employees – which means almost all of us! All full-time faculty are exempt employees and will need to use the new system starting 1 March. Overall, this is an improved system and I encourage you to watch the how-to video, attend the training, or ask me about the new process. It will be completed in two steps.

#### REQUESTING LEAVE:

- Planned leave (such as vacation time) can be submitted up to 90 days in advance, and will be routed to me for approval. This process is for when you will be absent one of the required duty days of the year. This is just an approval process and does not trigger any of the pay processes that go with leave.
- Sick leave not planned (which is often the case!) does not need to go through the approval process. If you have planned procedures, you can request sick leave in advance.
- When you log in to request leave, you will be able to submit up to 90 days out and will see three months of pay periods at a time.

# REPORTING LEAVE

- Any time you actually take leave (planned or unplanned), you will need to submit a leave report. This is done in the pay period you are taking the leave, and the report will be required to be submitted in any month you take leave.
- This reporting process will allow you to submit unplanned leave days such as sick days, as well as finalize any planned leave that was requested. If you did not take all of the leave requested, or were able to sneak in an extra day, you can make those adjustments as part of the reporting process.
- The reporting process will confirm the days of leave taken, and trigger the pay processes involved with taking leave.
- Leave reporting will be done by the month and when you log in you should see the current month's pay periods.
- As an exempt employee, all leave must be taken by the day (hence the 8-hour requirement previously)
  and leave only needs to be taken if you are missing required events (for example if you teach in the
  morning but need go to the doctors in the afternoon there is no need to take leave as an exempt
  employee for those hours missed). To reflect this policy the new system will now show leave in days
  rather than hours.
- The email went out two weeks ago about this change and included links to training sessions. If you are interested in attending training look for that email as there are many upcoming sessions.
- The system is active today and will transition over the next 30 days if you have approved leave and have and questions about which system to use, please let me know.
- I encourage all of you to watch the training video below. The video is also on the IT site for future reference, and should cover the vast majority of questions.
