SPAS Updates



- SoBT is working to develop a Agribusiness/Ag Tech degree to meet a growing demand for workforce programs at Hendry Glades
- SPAS has been asked for some supporting courses
 - SWS 1000C – Intro to Soils
 - AEB 2950 – SW FL Farm Tours
 - Based on credentialing degrees proposed for the courses, Jen Vonderwell has been working to create the courses, and HG faculty are excited to have the new options
 - We hope to include some of the lab portion of the course with a community garden proposal from the HG faculty
 - While we are working with SoBT on the new degrees, we will also be proposing an AA Pathway for Agriculture
 - Courses will be electives (not Gen Ed), and initially only offered at the HG campus

Simple Syllabus – Honorlock/textbooks



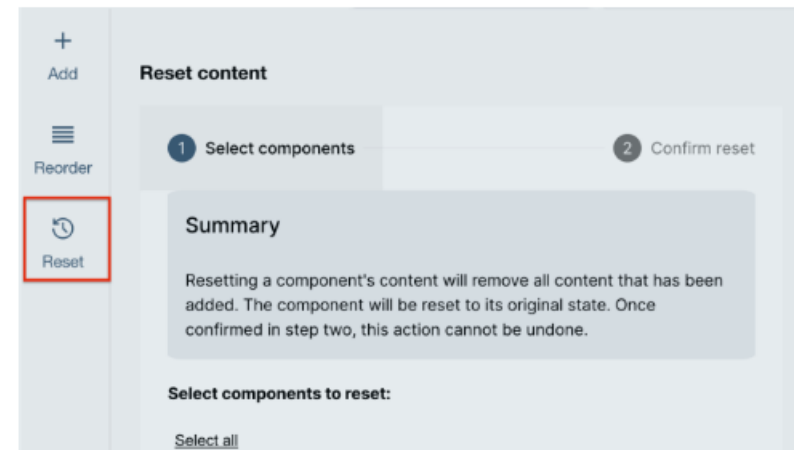
Important considerations

- Navigate to your syllabus and open it in edit mode.
- Click the Reset option from the menu on the left-hand side.
- A new window or overlay will appear, showing a list of your syllabus components.
- Check the box next to the component(s) you wish to reset. You can select one component or multiple. To reset the entire syllabus, you would select all components.

Cannot be undone: Resetting a component removes all manual edits, and this action cannot be reversed.

Removes your edits: The reset will revert the component to its original state (what is in the master syllabus), which may be blank or contain pre-populated text.

Editable components only: You can only reset components that have not been locked by your institution.





SPAS Updates



- Proctoring
 - In person – paper and pencil beat the technology tricks!!!
 - Setup, 360 room scan, unauthorized devices. . . .
 - I am working on a best practices guidance for having hard conversations – draft is out for review our partner organizations
 - When submitting reports, MUST include any evidence to go with narrative (video links, emails, etc.)
 - Be specific about what you see (at minute, eyes are off camera. . .)
- Smart glasses – they look like ray bans, and are hard to tell they are glasses. If you turn up the volume, you can often hear the glasses talking. Students wearing glasses should be asked to show them to the camera.
- Other people in the room – students are getting very good at positioning someone in the camera's blind spot – especially when they do a 270 degree room scan instead of a 360.
- Prerecorded tape of themselves taking an exam on a tablet placed in front of the camera. Caught when placing tablet, and could tell by the shift in image resolution.
- Using AI on phones. Hands out of camera view, and repeatedly looking away.
- Apple Handoff – will be in docking base with multiple icons
- Recommend having them put their phones on airplane mode?
- Using mirrors to get help with answers

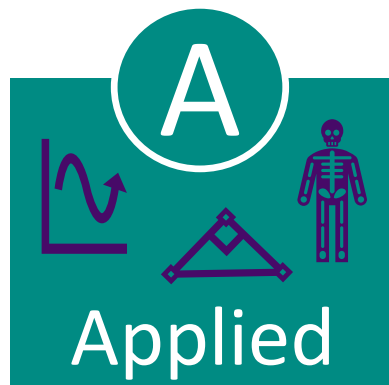
