I. Welcome

Dr. Caroline Seefchak, Department Chair, welcomed everyone back to the Fall 2011 semester with introductions

II. Mission Statement, College Prep/Developmental Studies

Dr. Seefchak passed out copies of the Mission Statement for the College.

Prep/Developmental Studies Department.

The mission of the College Prep/Developmental Studies Department at Edison State College is to provide a diverse population of students the opportunity to improve mathematics, reading, writing, and/or English language skills in order to achieve success within competitive academic and professional environments.

Dr. DeLuca reminded faculty that the Mission Statement and the Guiding Principles were created by the faculty over the course of several months last academic year.

Dr. Seefchak asked faculty to each put their copy of the Mission Statement in a prominent place and to read through it from time to time to stay focused on our stated purpose. Copy attached.

III. Message from Dr. Eileen DeLuca, Associate Dean

Dr. Deluca addressed the full-time faculty, welcoming everyone back to a new academic year. She reminded faculty that their faculty leader, department chair Dr. Seefchak, would responsible for the academic unit of our department, and she would be running the meetings.

Dr. DeLuca explained to faculty that she was committed to two separate very large college projects. She explained that she would be pulled into meetings for the upcoming SACS visit and for the ongoing QEP. She reminded faculty to rely on Dr. Seefchak for academic and curricular matters.

IV. Data Review – Student Surveys

Dr. Seefchak reviewed, with faculty, selected data from surveys that were sent to students, district-wide, at the end of Spring 2011 semester. Surveys measured aspects of student satisfaction with the programs of study in the department. See attached surveys, and see attached data. Full survey data will be posted to the Document Manager.

V. QEP News

There will be a Cornerstone Experience Web site, available through the Edison State College site, up soon. Dr. Seefchak demonstrated with screen shots of the site. When the link to the site becomes available, it will be posted.

Faculty have heard a lot about Cornerstone this Professional Development Week, but Dr. Seefchak emphasized that it is important that all faculty be familiar with our College's QEP, The Cornerstone Experience, and be knowledgeable that Edison State College is committed to its Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP) to improve first-year student learning through the Cornerstone Experience course. She briefly went over the the four frameworks on which the Cornerstone course will be based: Critical Thinking, Applied Learning, Relevancy, and Success Strategies. Edison State College's QEP is designed to enhance student satisfaction and engagement, and to improve retention, persistence, and graduation rates.

Dr. Seefchak told faculty that Dr. Steve Atkins has asked each department in the College to adopt a Cornerstone corner, or framework, on which to base curricular plans for this academic year. She also relayed a message, to faculty, from Dr. Atkins, that he appreciates all they are doing, district-wide, to understand and to promote the QEP.

Kevin Shriner, who is overseeing the implementation of the Cornerstone Experience, has been invited to the next department meeting. At that time, he will discuss, further, the college-wide training modules for faculty and staff who are interesting in teaching the Cornerstone class.

VI. College Prep/Developmental Studies Information

Exit exam legislation - An amendment to section 1008.30 of the Florida Statutes was passed, changing the mandate for state exit tests for developmental classes. Specifically, the requirement for a "passing score on a standardized ... test," has been eliminated and

has been replaced with a requirement that students "demonstrate successful mastery of the required developmental education competencies." Each discipline will work to establish district-wide policies concerning mastery of developmental courses. Discipline Curriculum Specialists will lead this initiative within the disciplines.

SAC - Common Course Assessments – begin this semester, as a pilot to next semester, when they will be required in all disciplines. The ENC discipline will use the Common Course Assessments in all classes, using a rubric designed by faculty members. The MAT discipline has specific activities and is working, this semester, on designing rubrics for measurement. EAP has created rubrics and is finalizing assessments. REA is examining Lexile tests for use with students.

College Prep/Developmental Studies Web site – Screen shots of our Department's comprehensive Web site were shown. A link to the site will be provided as soon as it is completed.

VII. Logistics/Space

Dr. DeLuca addressed the faculty about upcoming changes in locations. H 221 will be a classroom, and H 223 will be a shared faculty workspace for the Departments of College Prep/Developmental and Math and Science. Dr. DeLuca and Amanda will move to H 204 and H 205.

VIII. Syllabi and schedules

Faculty were reminded to please submit all syllabi and office hour schedules to Dr. Seefchak, via email, no later than Monday, August 22. Schedules will be printed, signed by Dr. DeLuca, and given to faculty members. Faculty were reminded that the ten required office hours should be spread out over all five working days.

IX. Textbooks

Dr. Seefchak relayed information given to department chairs about the college's commitment to saving students money as the costs of new textbooks keeps increasing. She told that faculty that she was asked to appoint a designee to participate in College Textbook Initiative Committee. Jessica Sobkowiak volunteered to represent the Department of College Prep/Developmental Studies on that committee.






Dr. Rebecca Gubitti brought out examples of embroidered shirts that she had made with the Edison State College Logo.


Selected Survey Data, as presented at District Faculty Meeting, 08-19-2011









This Math course prepared me for:



Which is your native language?


