Analysis of Delinquent Accounts Written Off For Fiscal Years 2008/09 through 2010/11

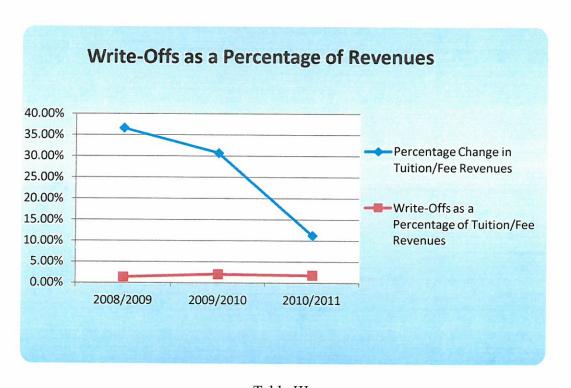
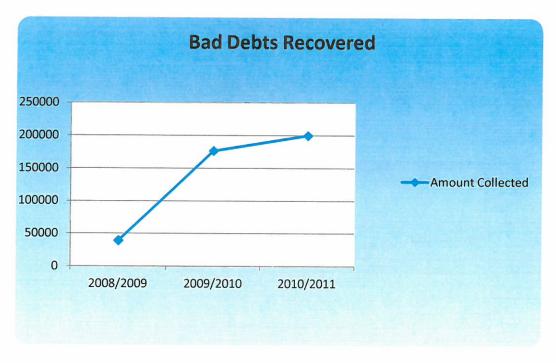

Approval of Naming Agreement with Presidio Networked Solutions, Inc. to Rename Building G on the Lee Campus "The Presidio Information Technology Center" For a Period of Five Years Pursuant to the Terms of the Attached Agreement and to Authorize the Purchase of Hardware, Software and Services for the Installation of a Voice Over Internet Protocol ("VOIP") Telephone System for the College

RECOMMENDATION:

The Administration recommends District Board of Trustees approval of the attached Naming Agreement with Presidio Networked Solutions, Inc. for the purchase of hardware, software and services for the installation of a Voice Over Internet Protocol ("VOIP") telephone system for the College.

STAFF ANALYSIS:

The College is seeking to enter into a gift agreement for the naming of the G building on Lee Campus with Presidio Networked Solutions, Inc. for a term of five years for a discount of \$500,000 on the purchase of hardware, software and related services.

The project will replace the 20-year-old+ existing phone system with a new VOIP solution which includes new hardware, software and related infrastructure.

The Administration recommends approval of the naming agreement with Presidio and purchase of new VOIP phone system and authorizes the President or his designee to execute all contracts and agreements necessary to carry out this approval.

CORPORATE GIFT AGREEMENT

This Corporate Gift Agreement ("Gift Agreement") is made effective as of June 25, 2013 ("Effective Date"), by and between Presidio Networked Solutions, Inc. ("Presidio") with offices at 5237 Summerlin Commons Boulevard, Fort Myers, Florida 33907 ("Donor") and The District Board of Trustees of Edison State College, Florida ("College") for the use and benefit of the College. Donor wishes to give the College as a gift a very substantial discount from the State Contract Price on the purchase of hardware, software and services for the installation of a Voice Over Internet Protocol ("VOIP") telephone system for the College. The College desires to accept such gift, subject to the terms set forth in this Gift Agreement.

TERMS OF THE GIFT

Donor hereby grants to the College a discount of \$500,000 for purchase of hardware, software and related services for the installation of a VOIP telephone system as set forth and described on the attached Exhibit (the "Contract").

The College shall acknowledge the Gift by naming the building currently designated as the "G Building" on the attached Exhibit B as the "Presidio Information Technology Center" for a period of five years following the execution of this agreement. The change in the name for the G Building will be implemented as follows:

Information about the College available on the internet will be updated to the extent reasonably possible and consistent with academic requirements to reflect the new name for G Building within the ninety day period following the execution of this agreement;

Paper literature reflecting the former designation of the G Building will be updated to reflect the new name for G Building beginning with orders for new paper products occurring after September 1, 2013; and,

Physical signage reflecting the name for G Building will be updated as such signage is replaced in the ordinary course of the College's business.

If Donor changes its name for any reason, then the College shall consult with Donor and come to a mutually agreeable decision with regard to the Naming. If either party is notified that the Donor's name or the Naming may infringe the intellectual property rights of a third party, the Board may remove the name from the Program until Donor is able to resolve any such claims. If Donor is unable to resolve such claims within 180 days following such notice, then the College may remove the Naming from the Program and the College shall have no further obligation or liability to Donor and shall not be required to return any portion of the Gift already paid.

If the Donor fails to timely fulfill its Gift commitment or perform the terms and conditions of the Contract, or if the Donor, any of its affiliated entities, or any of their respective officers or directors is involved in any type of material ethical violation or criminal charges, or the College reasonably and in good faith determines that circumstances have changed such that Donor's public image, products or services conflicts with the purposes or mission of the College, then the College, in its sole discretion, may remove the Naming from the building and the College shall

have no further obligation or liability to Donor and shall not be required to return any portion of the Gift already granted.

For purposes of publicizing the Gift and the Naming, College will have the right, without charge, to photograph the Donor's representatives and use the name and registered marks of the Donor in photographic, audiovisual, digital or any other form of medium (the "Media Materials") and to use, reproduce, distribute, exhibit, and publish the Media Materials in any manner and in whole or in part, including in brochures, website postings, informational and marketing materials, and reports and publications describing College's development and business activities.

At the end of the five year period following the execution of this agreement the College may continue to use the building name of Presidio Information Technology Center without payment of any royalty or license fee. Provided, however, that the College shall not be obligated to continue to the name should it wish to rename the facility.

This Gift Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties with regard to the matters referred to herein, and supersedes all prior oral and written agreement, if any, of the parties in respect hereto. This Gift Agreement may not be modified or amended except by written agreement executed by both parties hereto.

This Gift Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida, without regard to any conflict of laws rule or principle. 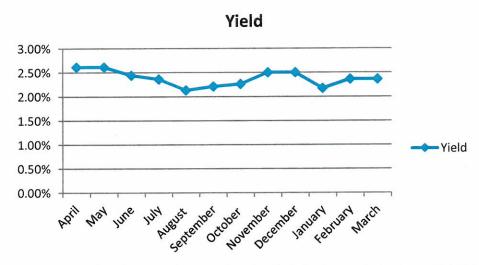
Investment Strategy

Investments will be limited to U.S. Treasuries, Government agency debt (including Agency mortgage-backed securities), taxable municipal bonds, and corporate bonds with the following portfolio limitations:

- Maximum allocation to taxable municipal bonds shall be 25%.
- Maximum allocation to corporate bonds shall be 25%.
- The minimum allocation to Government agency and agency mortgage-backed securities shall be 50%, with the additional provision that the maximum allocation to agency mortgage-backed securities shall be 20%. The Financing Corporation's policy limits investments to U.S. Treasuries, U.S. Government Agency Bonds, and Corporate Bonds. All investments must be rated AA or better by any of the three rating agencies. The policy prescribes a final maturity of 3.5 years for any single issue.

Investment Allocation





As of March 31, 2013 the Financing Corporation Portfolio had a market value of \$5,310,276. Through the fourth quarter ended March 31, 2013 the Financing Corporation had recorded investment income of \$24,394 net of fees.

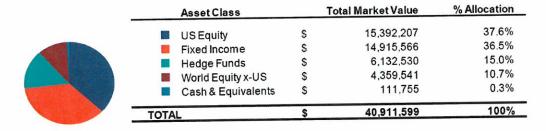
Investment Strategy

The Foundation's long-term and primary investment objective is to earn a total return, net of fees and with prudent levels of risk, which is sufficient to maintain the purchasing power of the endowed assets and support the annual spending policy.

To achieve this investment objective, the Foundation's endowment is allocated among six asset classes: Domestic Equities, International Equities, Alternative Investments, Fixed Income, Inflation Protection Assets, and Cash/Equivalents.

Investment Earnings

For the fiscal year ending, March 31, 2013, the main growth portfolio returned 9.09% (net) vs. 8.70% for the blended benchmark. The Foundation remains committed to its disciplined investment approach focusing on long-term investment goals while managing current cash needs with careful monitoring. A thoughtful rebalancing strategy remains in place.

2013 Market & Economic Outlook

While near term weakness in the equity markets would not be surprising, longer-term return opportunities are attractive in a sustainable US economic recovery. Europe will continue to see economic and fiscal problems. Fixed-income strategies will be increasingly challenged to provide the types of returns seen in recent years.

Summer time at ECHS – Lee is a time to catch up and re-tool for the upcoming year. With the exception of about 25 Dual Enrollment students taking summer classes, the high school building is basically empty of staff and students. Basic summer maintenance like waxing floors, roof repair, garden cleaning, organizing the exploration lab, and general cleaning up help keep the building looking like brand new each first day of each new school year. Staff spent a productive after school week to build and align their respective scope and sequence documents to the new Common Core standards and completed the foundational work for the first rounds of thematic units.

Ninth graders will begin the 2013-2014 school year learning the foundations of STEM and studying forms of measurement across the content areas. Science students will focus on measurement and atoms, while math students solve lines and linear equations. Engineering students will explore basic physics and simple machines, while communications students learn various software systems. Tenth graders will also continue their exploration of STEM topics and collaborative experiences in the first quarter. Biology will focus on cellular structure and function while anatomy students learn about system organization as well as the integument and skeletal systems. American government will introduce basic ideas about government and the formation of American government. World History will explore the Renaissance, Reformation and Scientific Revolution.

In terms of looking forward to next year and keeping with the college preparatory environment at ECHS, all students will partake in a scheduled advisory period throughout the coming school year. The advisory period is specifically designed to reinforce time management, critical thinking, and effective communication skills, as well as promote self-efficacy among students. During this period, time will be allotted for students to conference one-one-one with teachers, manage individual academic needs, and pursue their own independent study. The criteria for the independent study allow students to select their own exploratory topic and demonstrate their academic growth through quarterly capstone projects. Throughout the course of the year, students will funnel their ideas into a thesis in the design, research, and presentation of a final compendium project.

Measuring progress in schools is a difficult business and the current gauntlet of state mandated tests provide one perspective on the success of students and teachers. It is with a humble respect for the hard work put forth by ECHS – Lee students and teachers that the following summary results are presented. ECHS – Lee outperformed every single Lee County school in every single category of both FCAT and End of Course Tests. Of special note: 94% of all students passed both the science and math EOC tests – a combination unheard of around the state. In fact, all ECHS – Lee score categories rank between the top 1% and top 5% statewide. There can be little doubt that our focus on critical thinking and communication translates to academic success by any measure. It is also important to note that ECHS – Lee achieves these results with an open admission policy and finishes each year with an excess waiting list for new students.
