The School of Education is proposing a revision to the course description and topic outline for EDG 3410, Classroom Management and Communication, based on two circumstances:

1. A recent update (September 2019) to the Florida Department of Education's Uniform Core Curriculum Map for teacher preparation requires teacher preparation programs to identify which program-level courses address and assess specific curricula areas. Our B.S., Elementary Education, program must address "character-based classroom management" as part of this recent update, so our course description and topic outline for EDG 3410 have been revised to meet this expectation. 2. As presented at the November 2019 Curriculum Committee meeting, the School of Education is eliminating two courses in the B.S., Elementary Education, program:

EDE 4220 Integrated Health and Recreation (2 credits)
EDF 4782 Ethics and Law (2 credits).
Specific content from these two courses will now be addressed in EDG 3410, Classroom Management and Communication. School safety and social and emotional learning (SEL), previously addressed in EDE 4220, will now be included in EDG 3410. ## Section III, Justification for proposal

Teacher certification in the state of Florida includes a series of licensure exams, known as the Florida Teacher Certification Exams. Students in the B.S., Elementary Education, must pass all licensure exams as a requirement for graduation. The Elementary Education, K-6 Exam includes four subtests covering content and content pedagogy in the areas of language arts and reading; social science; science; and mathematics. The content assessed in each subtest is comprehensive, addressing standards associated with kindergarten through sixth grade. Our current curricular framework in the B.S., Elementary Education program includes courses that integrate two content areas into a single course, often making it difficult to support breadth and depth in the teaching of each critical content area and relevant pedagogy. This proposed program change includes the creation of four new courses, each representing a single content area. Elementary Education programs at other state colleges (Chipola College, Dayton SC, Polk SC, St. Petersburg College, and Northwest Florida SC) include two and as many as four courses dedicated to a single content area to support teacher certification licensure requirements.

1. Deletion of EDE 4220 Integrated Health and Recreation (2 credits): Key concepts and relevant learning outcomes will be integrated into other existing courses. For example, school safety will be addressed in EDG 3410 Classroom Management and Communication.
2. Deletion of EDF 4782 Ethics and Law (2 credits): Key concepts and relevant learning outcomes will be integrated into other existing courses. For example, EDG 3410 Classroom Management and Communication currently includes a required assignment associated with the Principles of Professional Conduct for the Education Profession in Florida. Two other courses, TSL 4080 Second Language Acquisition and Culture and EEX 3012 Educational Needs of Students with Exceptionalities, introduce students to the Florida Consent Decree and the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act.
3. Deletion of EDE 4226c Integrated Language Arts, Social Studies, and Literature with Practicum ( 4 credits) and EDE 4304c Integrated Math and Science with Practicum ( 4 credits): The addition of four new courses allows for each of the four content areas to be addressed within a single course, rather than as a combination of two content areas embedded into a single course as represented in the current courses.

The Bachelor of Science ( BS ) in Elementary Education is designed to prepare individuals to teach all subject areas grades K-6. The program provides an educational pathway for students who have earned an Associate in Arts degree to include EDF 2005. It is also a good option for students with a child development focus. Upon graduation, students will meet the mandated state teaching requirements for certification in Elementary Education with ESOL and Reading Endorsements. Students are strongly encouraged to complete EDF 2085 and EME 2040 as both courses remain Elementary Education program graduation requirements.

## Program Highlights:

The BS in Elementary Education is a Florida Department of Education (FLDOE) approved program that culminates with both Reading and ESOL endorsements. The program includes courses in teaching students with English as a second language, students with exceptionalities, reading competency, classroom management, assessment, and integrated approaches to teaching methodologies at the elementary school level. Students will learn to facilitate lessons that integrate math and science, health, music and movement, as well as literature, fine arts, language arts, and social sciences. Field Experience requirements are progressive in nature, building upon previous semester experiences. Students will observe teachers in the field, teach lessons through the practicum courses, and complete a full-time teaching internship in their final semester. Courses are offered for full-time and part-time students, with blended and online courses where applicable.

## Admission Requirements:

In addition to fulfilling the entrance requirements for Florida SouthWestern State College, applicants for the BS in Elementary Education degree program must meet the following requirements consistent with Florida Statute 1004.04:

Completion of the Associate in Arts (AA) degree or the equivalent, including all general education and required Florida mandated common course prerequisites. Students with a minimum of 60 transferable hours, with all general education requirements and prerequisites met, may apply for admission.

Applicants must have an overall grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale or have completed the requirements for a baccalaureate degree with a minimum grade point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale from any college or university accredited by a regional accrediting association, as defined by State Board of Education rule, with a minimum of 60 credit hours.

Demonstrated mastery of general knowledge, including the ability to read, write, and compute, by passing the General Knowledge Test of the Florida Teacher Certification Examination.

Applicants not meeting stated admissions criteria may petition for program admittance if they feel that there are mitigating circumstances. Applicants must submit an official petition form to the School of Education (forms are available online at http://www.fsw.edu/soe/forms).

Requirements to Enroll in Upper Division Courses:

Upon admission to the BS program, students must attend a mandatory orientation session prior to enrollment in upper division (3000 and 4000 level) courses.

To participate in the program, students must be fingerprinted and screened by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and the FBI prior to entering any school.

Prior to enrollment in any upper division courses, students must complete ENC 1101 - Composition I, ENC 1102 - Composition II and one general education math course.

To be eligible to enroll in EDE 4940 - Internship in Elementary Education, students must have passed all sections of the General Knowledge Test, the Professional Educator's Exam and the Subject Area Exam; and attempted the Professional Educator's Exam and the Subject Area Exam.

Cross-enrollment approval: Baccalaureate degree seeking students must obtain prior approval to cross enroll (as a transient student) in courses intended to fulfill upper division program requirements. Approval will be determined by the appropriate dean in collaboration with program faculty. Students initiate this process using www.floridashines.org/.

Upper Division Transfer Course Review: Students who have completed previous upper division coursework in an Education Program may present those courses for evaluation by the Elementary Education Department Chair. Students may transfer equivalent courses as determined by the State Common Course Numbering System. However, Florida SouthWestern State College reserves the right to
deny common course number credit for courses in which practicum or internship components reside. Florida SouthWestern State College's Office of the Registrar will ensure that previous coursework meets all relevant academic standards before acceptance for transfer. The Dean of the School of Education and the Credit Review Committee will ensure adherence to the above admissions criteria. Students must fulfill all required competencies, standards, skills and dispositions within the Bachelor of Science in Education Programs and may be required to submit additional documentation to support completion requirements. $25 \%$ of the 120 credits for the degree must be earned at FSW.

Students who have been fully admitted to the Elementary Education program, but do not enroll in at least one course for three consecutive semesters, are required to apply for readmission to the program. Upon readmission, students are governed by the catalog requirements of the readmission year. Students with special circumstances preventing them from being readmitted to the program may make an appeal to the Dean of the School of Education for their enrollment to be reactivated. Reactivation appeals must include a letter justifying the request, a letter of support from a faculty member, and any and all documentation to support the student's appeal. Reactivated students will be governed by the catalog in place during the year in which they were first admitted to the program.

In addition to adherence to the Florida SouthWestern State College Student Code of Conduct, policies, and procedures, teacher candidates must adhere to disposition policies, unit policies and procedures as published in the School of Education Handbook.

## Service Learning Requirement (30 hours)

All Education baccalaureate degrees have a 30-hour service learning requirement. Ten hours will be completed each semester, leading up to final internship. The requirement begins to be met with completion of EDG 4004, and the final culmination and validation of hours will be part of the final internship portfolio for each student.

Students must complete a minimum of 120 credit hours to earn the B.S. degree. Typically, general electives are fulfilled with lower division coursework taken for completion of the Associate in Arts.

Students must pass all required sections of the Florida Teachers Certification Examinations (FTCE) for certification within the State of Florida.

While Florida SouthWestern State College governs a student's program requirements, changes to a program emanating from the Florida State Board of Education will take precedence over the College catalog and may alter a student's program of study.

The Florida State Board of Education requires all education students to demonstrate competency in all of the revised Florida Educator Accomplished Practices (FEAPs), Florida Subject Area Competencies (FSAC), and Professional Educator Competencies and Skills (PECS) as a condition of graduation, including completion of a professional portfolio. Elementary and Middle Grades Language Arts students must demonstrate achievement of all State required ESOL Competencies and Performance Standards and Reading competencies as a condition of graduation.

While the certificate meets the needs of some, it does not meet the needs for all students. The subject matter of this AS is essential to many digital natives. The future of employment is changing drastically and students who want to become digital content producers must have the skills to work across many digital mediums. They must also become creative producers who can adapt to a constantly changing workforce. We want to provide a program that will give students the tools to become "digital Swiss Army knives." The process for developing this program consisted of several meetings between the supporting faculty members: Professor Dana Roes, Dr. Ryan Wurst, and Professor Mike Molloy.

#### Abstract

The field of digital content creation is constantly expanding and requires personnel who are ready to create, alter and produce new projects in the digital and multimedia arts. While this course is a necessity from the industry perspective, it is also one that the students at FSW are already demanding. Our student population want to become "digital Swiss Army knives." They want the skills to create digital projects and to then make a living from those skills.


## Associate of Science Digital Art and Multimedia Production

## Purpose:

The Associate in Science (AS) in Digital Arts and Multimedia Production program provides a pathway to the skills and training for professional work in the expanding digital content creation industry. The sequence of courses prepares students to communicate, produce, and utilize industry standard technical training in the creation of digital and multimedia content.

Students will create, edit, and produce digital content to prepare them for further education and careers in the fields of Games and Interactivity Production, Music Production and Sound Engineering, Digital Photography, Filmmaking, Animation, and Graphic Design. As the creative digital industry is in a state of constant flux students will be introduced to avenues for adapting to and engaging with the ongoing changes in the marketplace. Students will gain experience in many areas of digital art and multimedia production and will be prepared to enter industry or create their own career pathways. This program is designed for full-time and part-time students.

## Learning Outcomes:

Graduates of the program will be able to:

1. Demonstrate a technical and creative understanding of industry hardware and software related to digital art and multimedia production.
2. Create and adjust digital art and multimedia presentations in a variety of areas.
3. Design and create still imagery through digital photography and graphic creation techniques.
4. Produce creative video and animated content.
5. Utilize audio technology to aid in the creation of digital art and multimedia.
6. Utilize all aspects of computer applications from coding to software manipulation in order to create new projects.
7. Demonstrate the skills to communicate and effectively work in a team.
8. Develop mathematical skills that will inform the proper use of hardware and software in digital art and multimedia production.
9. Build a professional portfolio and demonstrate the skills needed to become employed in the industry.

## Nursing, AS

Graduates of the Associate in Science in Nursing (ASN) Program are prepared to becone lieensed as an entry level Registered Nurse (RN). The nursing curriculum incorporates classroom instruction, laboratory, simulation educalion, and clinical practice in the care of diverse populations. Local health facilities are utilized for clinical practice, including community agencies, acute care institutions. long-term and ambulatory care facilities. Graduates of the program possess knowledge, values, skills, and compassion: all are essential for professional nursing practice in a dynamic and rapidly changing licalith care environment.
There are two options available in the ASN program, traditional (day hours Monday-Friday on campus classes) and ANEW (Evening and Weekends, online and on campus blended format). The ANEW schedule is not a part-time Nursing program. It will require full-time commitment but it will be offered on a schedule that will consist of online classroon instruction with labs and elinical rotations offered on an evening (Monday-Friday) and weekend schedule.

## Admission Requirements:

The ASN Program consists of 72 credit hours. These hours include general education ( 16 credits) program specific courses ( 14 credits), and Nursing core courses ( 42 credits). Competitive applicants will have completed most or all of their general education and program specific courses before starting the Nursing core courses.

Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS)
Nursing Core Courses, are completed in a four (4) semester cohor/group sequence. Students who begin the program in the Fall semester can successfully complete the program in 20 months. Students who begin the program in the Spring semester can successfully complete the program in 24 months.

The Traditional and ANEW schedules for the ASN Program will both require discipline and commitment. Nursing education is rigorous and must be top priority from the first semester through graduation to be suecessful on the NCLEX-RN licensing exam and to becone a professional nurse.

## LPN Florida Department of Education Gold Standard and Statewide Articulation Agreements:

This Gold Standard Career Pathways Statewide Articulation Agreement guarantees the minimum award of course credits or a block of credit toward the above AAS/AS program is 1012 hours of credit. This agreement does not preclude the awarding of additional credits by any college through local agreements. The Licensed Practical Nurse certification, or National Licensed Practical Nurse (NCLEX-PN) certification represents industry acknowledgement of technical skill attainment of competencies in the Nursing (Associate Degree) R.N. program. To be eligible for articulation, the student must show evidence of their current Licensed Practical Nurse certitication. or National Licensed Practical Nurse (NCLEX-PN) certification and it must have been issued within three (3) years prior to their enrollment in the progran.

## Academic Policy and Progression Criteria:

The academic standards in the Nursing program are very rigorous and require full-time commitment.
A grade of "C" or better must be earned in General Education ( 16 credits) and Program Specific ( 14 credits) courses.
The ASN Program uses the following grading system: $(90-100=\mathrm{A}, 80-89.99=\mathrm{B}, 77-79.99=\mathrm{C} .60-76.99=\mathrm{D}$, Below $60=\mathrm{F})$.
A grade of "C" or better must be earned in each Nursing/NUR course ( 42 credits) in order to progress in the program.
A grade less than " C " in a Nursing/NUR course will require a reattempt.
A Nursing/NUR course may be repeated or reattempted only once. If a grade of " C " or better is not achieved when the course is repeated or reattempted, dismissal from the program will result.
If a grade of "C" or better is not achieved or Withdrawal/W grade occurs in two or more Nursing/NLIR courses. dismissal from the program will result.

## Nursing, AS

Graduates of the Associate in Science in Nursing (ASN) Program are prepared to become licensed as an entry level Registered Nurse (RN). The nursing curriculum incorporates classroom instruction, laboratory, simulation education, and clinical practice in the care of diverse populations. Local health facilities are utilized for clinical practice, including community agencies, acute care institutions, long-term and ambulatory care facilities. Graduates of the program possess knowledge, values, skills, and compassion; all are essential for professional nursing practice in a dynamic and rapidly changing health care environment.

There are two options available in the ASN program, traditional (day hours Monday-Friday on campus classes) and ANEW (Evening and Weekends, online and on campus blended format). The ANEW schedule is not a part-time Nursing program. It will require full-time commitment but it will be offered on a schedule that will consist of online classroom instruction with labs and clinical rotations offered on an evening (Monday-Friday) and weekend schedule.

## Admission Requirements:

The ASN Program consists of 72 credit hours. These hours include general education ( 16 credits), program specific courses ( 14 credits), and Nursing core courses ( 42 credits). Competitive applicants will have completed most or all of their general education and program specific courses before starting the Nursing core courses.

## In Order to apply, Applicants must have successfully completed:

- STA 2023 Statistical Methods I
- BSC 1085 C or BSC 1093 C - Anatomy and Physiology I
- BSC 1086C or BSC 1094C - Anatomy and Physiology II
- Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS)

Nursing Core Courses, are completed in a four (4) semester cohort/group sequence. Students who begin the program in the Fall semester can successfully complete the program in 20 months. Students who begin the program in the Spring semester can successfully complete the program in 24 months.

- Screening for tuberculosis (TB)
- Certification in American Heart Association Basic Life Support for Health-Care Providers
- Proof of personal health insurance throughout enrollment in the program, naming the student and dates of coverage.


## Academic Policy and Progression Criteria:

The academic standards in the Nursing program are very rigorous and require full-time commitment.

- A grade of " C " or better must be earned in General Education (16 credits) and Program Specific ( 14 credits) courses.
- The ASN Program uses the following grading system: $(90-100=\mathrm{A}, 80-89.99=\mathrm{B}, 77-79.99=\mathrm{C}, 60-76.99=\mathrm{D}$, Below $60=F)$.
- A grade of "C" or better must be earned in each Nursing/NUR course (42 credits) in order to progress in the program.
- A grade less than "C" in a Nursing/NUR course will require a reattempt.
- A Nursing/NUR course may be repeated or reattempted only once. If a grade of "C" or better is not achieved when the course is repeated or reattempted, dismissal from the program will result.
- If a grade of "C" or better is not achieved or Withdrawal/W grade occurs in two or more Nursing/NUR courses, dismissal from the program will result.
- Dismissal from the Nursing Program will occur if a student is deemed unsafe or unprofessional in clinical practice/patient care.
- The Academic Review Committee (ARC) will evaluate each student who is unsuccessful in a course or has an interruption in their program sequence. An Alternate program plan will be developed by the committee in collaboration with the student
- Attendance and punctuality is mandatory for all classroom, laboratory, and clinical activities. The third and each subsequent classroom absence and/or partial absence will result in a 5 -point deduction from the final course grade. Attendance ( $100 \%$ ) is required for all simulation and clinical activities.

1.2. The regrouping of General Education courses in the specific areas of Communications, Humanities, Fine Arts, and Communications; Social and Behavioral Sciences; and Natural Sciences and Mathematics reflects SACS area requirements. ## Purpose

The Associate in Science (AS) in Accounting Technology program prepares students for employment and/or promotion in occupations where a general knowledge of accounting. bookkeeping, tax preparation, and general business are required. It also prepares students for entry into a variety of baccalaureate degree progranns in related disciplines such as accounting, business administration, management, and finance. The content includes but is not limited to the principles. procedures, and theories of organizing, maintaining and auditing business and financial transactions and the preparation of accompanying financial records and reports for internal and extemal uses.

This course will equip students to start a new venture or take over a family business by providing a step-by-step process. Students will apply the course concepts learned in ENT 2000 to their businesses. This course ENT 2000 will transfer to FGCU as a general education course in Social Science, if a student decides to obtain a bachelor's degree from FGCU.

Entrepreneurship is an essential human behavior that underpins societal progress. Individual economic activity dominates day-to-day behavior in all but a few western societies and cultures today. Most of the world's population depends on an entrepreneurial livelihood. Without an understanding of the role of the entrepreneur in economic formation and the conception of markets, a basic historical understanding of societal development is limited. Therefore, this course covers the many facets of entrepreneurship and its implications for careers, business, and society. It is designed to introduce the entrepreneurial mindset to students pursuing all College majors.

The study of entrepreneurship draws from and contributes to theories rooted in sociology, psychology, anthropology, and economics. The entrepreneurial process is, as its very core, a social phenomenon. People identify opportunities and act on them to create value for others. Furthermore, the creation of new organizations (a common behavior of entrepreneurs) is the creation of social structure, bringing together people to achieve a common goal. The formation of new ventures is taught in this class as an evidence-based methodology to problem identification, analysis, and decision-making. Accordingly, the assignments are designed to develop and assess critical thinking skills.

1.1. The change consolidates General Education course into the General Education area to reflect 15 credit hours of General Education coursework in accordance with F.A.C. 6A-14.030.
1.2. The regrouping of General Education courses in the specific areas of Humanities, Fine Arts, and Communications; Social and Behavioral Sciences; and Natural Sciences and Mathematics reflects SACS area requirements. - United States small businesses employed 58.9 million people, or $\mathbf{4 7 . 5 \%}$ of the private workforce, in 2015.

- Firms with fewer than 100 employees have the largest share of small business employment. Figure 1 provides further details on firms with employees. (Source: SUSB)
- Private-sector employment increased $1.8 \%$ during the 12 month period ending in February 2018. This was above the increase of $1.0 \%$ during the prior 12-month period. (Source: CPS)
- The number of proprietors increased in 2016 by $2.3 \%$ relative to the previous year. (Source: BEA)
- Small businesses created 1.9 million net jobs in 2015 . Firms employing fewer than 20 employees experienced the largest gains, adding 1.1 million net jobs. The smallest gains were in firms employing 100 to 499 employees, which added 387,874 new jobs. (Source: SUSB)

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, (20\%) of small businesses either fail or are no longer in business by the end of the first year. The trend worsens to (34\%) by the second year, (50\%) by the fifth year, and (70\%) by the tenth year (BLS, 2017). Research by CB Insights polled entrepreneurs whose small business failed, which revealed that (42\%) of these small businesses lacked market need for their product of service, (29\%) had a lack of sufficient capital, (23\%) did not have the right team, while (19\%) of these small businesses fail due to superior competition (Griffith, 2014). Thereby, (61\%) in total lacked a market feasibility analysis of their product or service (42\%) or insight about industry competitors (19\%) as the reason for failure.

Most successful entrepreneurs equip themselves with detailed knowledge about the industry and the competitive market (Rose, 2015). Further, to keep up with the latest small business trends it
is important to gain a sense of the specific market share that will impact business profits (SBA, n.d.). The key to defining a competitive edge that creates sustainable revenue is developing a competitive analysis that helps business owners learn from businesses competing for the same potential customers (SBA, n.d.). Entrepreneurs armed with specific industry competitor knowledge and a market feasibility study were found to have a competitive edge (Rose, 2016). While entrepreneurs who were mentored received helpful example of values, attitudes, and behavior (Bosma et al., 2012).

## Purpose

The Associate in Science (AS) in Business Administration and Management program prepares students for further education and for careers in entry level supervisory positions in a variety of organizations. In addition to general education coursework, the content is comprised of a broad-based business curriculum with emphasis on selected theories of management and decision making and the knowledge and understanding necessary for managing people and functions.

## Program Structure

This program is a planned sequence of instruction consisting of 60 credit hours in the following areas: 18 credit hours of General Education Requirements, 30 credit hours of Business Administration and Manageınent Core Requirements, 7-9 credit hours of Specialization Track Requirements and 3-8 credit hours of approved electives.
The Business Management Specialization track consists of 7 credit hours in courses such as Accounting and Small Business Management. A degree in business adninistration and management can prepare you for a career in project management, tean management, information management or operations management.

The Entrepreneurship Specialization track consists of 12 credit hours in courses related to entrepreneurship, small business management, and starting a business. Students will acquire a comprehensive set of skills that prepares them for working in either their own start-up or large established organizations across a variety of industries.
The Risk Management Insurance Specialization track consists of 9 credit hours in courses related to the insurance industry. Degree-seeking students who successfully complete the three insurance courses as part of their program of study will receive licenses 2-15 (Health \& Life). 20-44 (Personal lines), and 4-40
(Customer Representative) exam-free after they graduate with their associate degree. Risk Management \& Insurance positions include Customer Service Agent, Agent or Broker, Account Manager, Independent Agent, Claims Adjuster, Underwriter

The Small Business Management Certificate and the Business Development and Entrepreneurship Certificate are comprised of core courses in the AS Business Administration and Management degree. These certificates can be earned before the student has earned the AS Business Adnininistration and Management degree

## Network Systems Tec hnology, AS

## Purpose

The Associate in Science (AS) in Network Systems Technology program offers a sequence of courses that present coherent and rigorous content aligned with challenging academic standards and relevant technical knowledge and skills needed to prepare for further education and careers such as cabling specialists, network control operators, data communications analysts, network technicians, computer security specialists, network specialists, network managers, network systems analysts, network systems technicians, network troubleshooters, WAN/LAN managers, or systems administrators.

The content includes but is not limited to planning, installing, configuring, monitoring, troubleshooting and managing computer networks in a LAN/WAN environment. Students will be prepared to apply conceptual and theoretical knowledge to the workplace utilizing technical skills learned during the program.

## Program Structure

This program is a planned sequence of instruction consisting of 60 credit hours in the following areas: 18 credit hours of General Education Requirements, 39 credit hours of Network Systems Technology Core, and 3 credit hours of General Electives. The Associate in Science (AS) in Computer Programming and Analysis program offers a sequence of courses that provides coherent and rigorous content aligned with challenging academic standards and relevant technical knowledge and skills needed to prepare for further education and careers such as entry level programmers, programmer specialists, computer programmers, senior programmers, chief business programmers, programmer analysts, and information systems programmers.

The content prepares individuals to analyze business situations and to design, develop and write computer programs; to store, locate, and retrieve specific documents, data, and information; analyze problems using logic/analysis tools, code into computer language; test, monitor, debug, document and maintain computer programs. More than one programming language is addressed in this degree program.

## Program Structure

This program is a planned sequence of instruction consisting of 60 credit hours in the following areas: 18 credit hours of General Education Requirements and 42 credit hours Computer Programming and Analysis Core Requirements (which includes 6 credit hours of a Programming Language and 6 credit hours of Specified Electives).
