

The Digital Media/Multimedia Production Certificate Program will prepare students for employment as specialists in use of digital technology for the production of digital art, film, and music applications. The program also provides supplemental training for persons previously or currently trained as fine artists cemployed in Information Technology who need cutting-edge training in the use of graphics and music in environments. Graduates of this program can potentially obtain employment as graphic artists or film technicians or editors across various industries including newspaper production, advertising agencies, o other industry that uses digital applications.
