Section V: Justification for Proposal

Provide justification (below) for this proposed curriculum action

Florida Department of Education along with the Florida Division of the State Fire Marshal has changes the certificate program hours from 398 to 492 hours effective July 1 2020. Pursuant to 633.128, Florida Statutes, the Department of Financial Service, Division of State Fire Marshal, has established training requirements for firefighters and volunteer firefighters. These requirements are implemented by Rule 69A-37.055, Florida Administrative Code. This program is a planned sequence of instruction consisting of two occupational completion points. (NOTE: The curriculum frameworks are subject to change by the Bureau of Fire Standards and Training (BFST) as IAW statutory or Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.) rule changes.)

State mandate distributes the increased certificate program hours across the two required Certificate courses, which must be renumbered as a result: FFP 0010C Firefighter I (206 hours) is to be replaced by FFP 0030C Firefighter I (191 hours), and FFP 0020C Firefighter II (192 hours) is to be replaced by FFP 0031C Firefighter II (301 hours). To enact this change in FSW systems, courses FFP 0010C Firefighter I and FFP 0020C Firefighter II must be discontinued, and new courses FFP 0030C Firefighter I and FFP 0031C Firefighter II must be created.

Because a cohort of students were already enrolled in FFP 0010C in Summer 2020 (D term) prior to this mandate's effective date, FFP 0010C clock hours (206) were decreased to 191, and FFP 0020C clock hours (192) were increased to 301.

FFP 0020C Firefighter II is to be discontinued at the end of the Fall 2020 semester, to be replaced by FFP 0031C Firefighter II starting in Spring 2021.
