Canvas New Feature Releases

Canvas is an ever evolving platform and new features are introduced on a regular basis. Some you may notice right away, like the brand new **History menu** in the navigation menu, and others might be more subtle, like **Course-Level Notification Preferences** and the addition of a **Global Announcement** page. Here are a few features available now or coming soon:

- ▶ **Bulk Assignment Editing** update all those due dates in one fell swoop!
- Bulk Page Delete need to clean out the cobwebs?
- Coming January 2021: The Rich Content Editor (RCE) is getting a new look and feel. You will want to check this one out! The RCE is the set of editing tools that you use to create all your content in Canvas Pages, Assignments, Discussions and more.




Kaltura

Kaltura is a video platform that is built with educators in mind! It does much more than just play a recorded video. Did you know that you can...

- Add Interactive Video Quizzes within the video to help students assess their understanding
- Add clickable objects to your videos called Hotspots to link to... basically anything!
- Automatically caption your videos to ensure all students have access to your course content
