### **Enrollment Update**

We are off to an excellent beginning to the fall semester. As of this morning (8/31/16) our total headcount is up 3.9 % compared to last year with over 16,200 students enrolled. The Office of Institutional Research confirmed this morning that this is the 3rd highest fall enrollment in the history of the institution. Thank you all for all you are doing to help students.

### Interim Dean and New Dean Search

With the retirement of Dr. Emery Alford this summer, Dr. Martin McClinton is serving as Interim Dean of the School of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences in addition to his role as Dean of the School of Pure and Applied Sciences.

The trip was coordinated through FSW's Center for International Education.
