Director Whitney Rhyne kicked off the meeting by announcing that the <u>D2G webpage</u> was updated to include a listing of each of the four main workgroups as part of the documentation of FSW's SACSCOC narrative. Whitney also shared that Dr. Martin McClinton wrote about the work this committee in section 12.1 of the reaffirmation narrative.


The committee reviewed several Fall 2020 engagement survey items linked to fall semester success and continued spring enrollment in comparison to Fall 2019 before the FSW initiated proactive outreach and support. The number of respondent and timing of the survey did vary from Fall 2019 to Fall 2020 as the committee worked to gain valuable information and enhance college supports. Director Rhyne shared exciting data showing the success data (% of credits earned, semester GPA, and continued enrollment) of students who "disagree" or "strongly disagree" to the statement "I feel academically prepared to succeed at FSW." Comparing fall 2019 (before proactive communications) to students who disagree or strongly disagreed with the statement in fall 2020 (with proactive outreach), we see that students were

more successful as determined by % of credit hours earned, semester GPA, and continued enrollment in the following semester. Findings are summarized in the table below.

The committee reviewed the wellness question survey results by campus. It was interesting to see some of the difference Lee Campus and online students report the highest levels of stress (4 & 5 on a 5-point scale). H/G students noted the lowest percentage of students who report the higher levels of stress. However, H/G students noted the greatest percentage of students who completed the survey that noted lower levels of mental health and energy (1 & 2 on a 5-point scale).
